INTRODUCTION

 - they are on the proposition

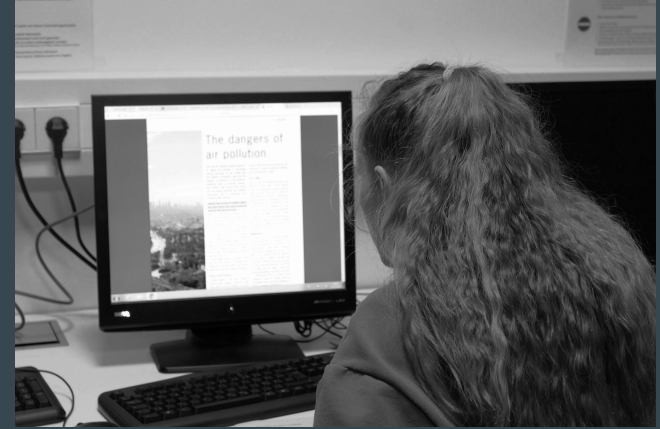

 - they are on the opposition



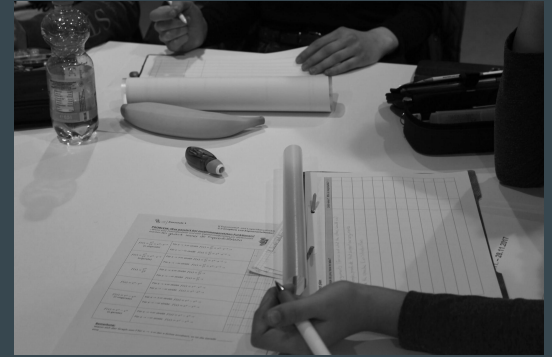
CLUELESS BALLS INTERVIEW
