

In order to get familiar with the archeological and historical techniques which enable us to find out about our past, we were shown how to excavate and also how to make crockery as our ancestors used to. So we went to the museum to copy the most common shapes of the Prehistoric crockery and we used clay to model vases.



We used this very ancient technique: the artisan made some little bands of clay and put them together, giving each object its specific shape using basically hands and very simple tools without the potter's wheel, which will be invented later on. We have also reproduced some very simple linear decorations which date back to Prehistoric Age.






Title: Taped Minion
