END OF THE PROJECT

"AD-DICTED TO EDUCATION" is an Erasmus+ KA2 project that we have developed together with 5 other schools in Poland, Greece, Croatia, Romania and Italy for 2 years. Due to the situation caused by the pandemic during this second course we had to adapt our project and carry out virtually the mobility we had planned to carry out physically, using computer means, eTwinning and other applications and digital tools.

During the 2 years of the project, advertising has been the driving force behind the activities. This second year, the main objective has been to promote knowledge and care for the European Cultural Heritage. We have also worked on language competence (English, French and Spanish), as well as the use of New Technologies and digital tools in a collaborative way.

To this end, we have carried out various activities such as advertising posters, book trailers to celebrate Book Day, we have worked on the traditions and festivities of the partner countries, etc. In addition, we have carried out 2 virtual mobility with students organized by Italy and Spain, the latter being the final mobility of the project.

What remains to be done is to encourage the results obtained by this project to continue to be disseminated, to last over time and to be used by more people.



Virtual mobility with students. Italy and Spain

Teachers and students from all the project countries took part in the two virtual mobility events that took place in March and May, organized by Italy and Spain respectively.



During these mobilities, activities related to traditions, monuments, gastronomy, etc.. were carried out. The aim was to enable pupils from all countries to get to know each other, communicate and work together in a collaborative way on European cultural heritage and advertising.


These activities were carried out using digital tools such as Zoom, eTwinning and Drive. Examples of these are:

• **Oral presentations** on local monuments and their conservation and on typical products of each country.






• Kahoots that were fulfilled by the participants from all the countries simultaneously.



• Virtual maps where monuments and the typical products of each country were located. Virtual map of monuments

• **Workshops** in which children worked in a collaborative way about books, famous paintings, recipes...





The results of these workshops were: advertising posters about books (<u>e Book with publicity posters</u>), invented stories about pictures, <u>an international recipe book</u>, advertising brochures to visit the countries of the project, etc.



• **Dances:** each country prepared a dance with typical songs in order to encourage other children to dance.

 Cultural activities: such as a visit to the UNESCO-protected Santa Giulia Musemu in Brescia (Italy), a sightseeing tour of Toledo or concerts by students from the host countries. For these activities we count on the collaboration of the Professional Conservatory of Music of Alcázar de San Juan and Campo de Criptana, and de DG of Tourism, trade and handicrafts.





More activities

During the second and third term of the course, we focused on working on the traditions, festivities and gastronomy of the partner countries. The most relevant activities has been:


- Analysis of advertisements in which those topics appeared.



• Chat in French: students who study French as a subject at their centers held a video conference to introduce themselves, talk about their hobbies, tastes, etc...





• Work on Book day: each country works on a book by a national author and prepares a book trailer about it. The partners make a premiere via a videoconference to watch together the videos produced.



• **Recipe exchange:** each centre selects a typical recipe and uploads it to the Twinspace. Students from another country must prepare the proposed recipe and record a video of the preparation.



Croatian fritters (III)

Preparation 1. Whisk the egg, add yogurt, sugar, rum and salt. Add flour and baking powder. Mix everything together. The dough should be thick.

2. Heat up the oil in a deeper pot. There should be enough oil that the fritters can swim in it. Once you have heated up the oil, reduce the heat to low. If you fry the fritters with high heat, they will not swell.

3. Take some dough with a spoon and put it in the oil. 4. Once they are fried enough on one side, they usually turn over on the other side, if not, just touch them with a fork and they will turn.

5. Fry them over medium heat






Work in our centre










We also have a video conference with the author where the children ask him a number of questions about his work and books. This activity has also been carried out in Primary Education.
