# WHAT CONSISTS THE PLAN?

The sustainable urban mobility plan concept considers the functional urban area and foresees that plans are developed in cooperation across different policy areas and sectors, across different levels of government and administration and in cooperation with citizens and other stakeholders.





# THE COMMISSION

The commission has actively promoted this concept for several years. Guidelines were developed, which provide local authorities with clear framework for the development and implementation of such a plan.



The European Commission has taken action on urban transport through various policies and projects including CIVITAS. The 2009 was a major step for European action in this area, the 2011 the White Paper on Transport, highlights the importance of the urban dimension. In addition after the 2011, the European Commission came up in 2013 with an Urban Mobility Package that addresses different initiatives.



# THE PROJECTS

Sustainable Urban Mobility Plans are an instrument that contributes to reaching the climate and energy targets set by EU leaders. Several projects aim to promote the implementation of SUMP's and cofinanced by the intelligent Energy Europe Programme of the European Commission.





# THE QUEST AND PLANNING

Quest is a quality management tool developed to help small and medium-sized cities to set up. It supports european cities in making real progress towards a more sustainable urban trasport system. Cities receive a QUEST certificate which recognises their recognises their efforts in sustainable urban mobility planning





The ch4llenge project helps support the advancement of European cities at different stages of their Sustainable Urban Mobility Planning process. It addresses significant barriers for wider take-up of SUMPs in Europe, in particular the project focuses on four priorities.





# ADVANCE AND ECOMOBILITY

The advance project aims to improve the urban transport systems in European cities. It supports cities and municipalities on their way towards a more sustainable urban mobility.
