It's a doll or puppet from clay.

It's called

Plaggona.

We made it in Art class with Mrs Amalia.

Plaggonas were ancient Greek dolls.

It was one of the favourite games of girls in ancient Greece. It was usually made of clay. Sometimes the doll's clothing was painted, other times girls made clothes for them. Apart from the joy of the game, the plaggonas had educational character too, like a girl's introduction to the role and obligations as a woman in society. The plaggonas were offerings to the goddess Artemis on the eve of the wedding of the girl.
