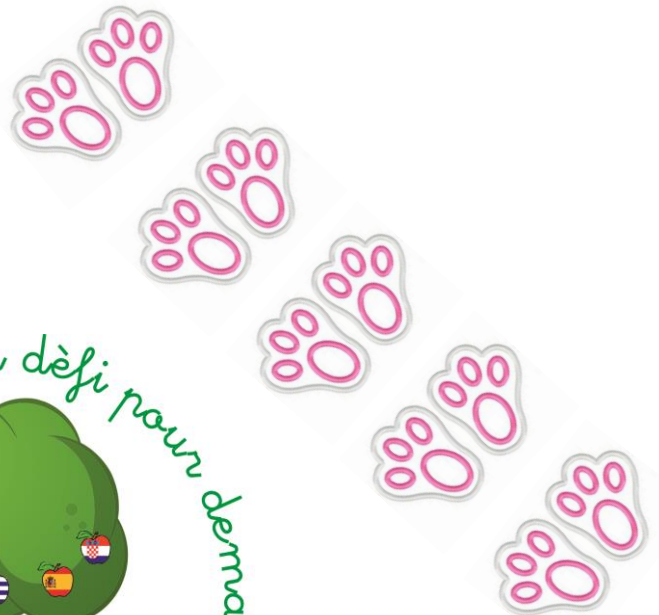
1 Where do rabbits live?

The place where they live is in holes that dig in the ground, have tunnels through which they move and avoid being swallowed by predators. These places have warm temperatures and are very dark. Covered with branches or leaves to prevent those who may harm them from seeing their hiding places.

Now that the rabbit is domesticated, it must live in a place that is quiet and not subject to many changes in temperature. They feel good if there is light, but should not be exposed to too much heat.

2 characteristics of the rabbit

- Its size varies from 34 to 50 centimeters.

- Its weight varies from 1.1 to 2.5 kg.

3 classes for rabbits

Classes of rabbits are determined by their use:

For meat production: Blue and white rabbit Beveren, Chinchilla, New Zealand, American blue and white and others.

For leather production: The Rex Rabbit or the Havana Rabbit.

For the textile industry: The Angora rabbit.

For pets: The dwarf rabbit Belier, and also the Angora.



4 meals

If he stays at home, he should eat a lot of hay and drink a lot of water every day. The water should be changed as often as possible and placed in large cages so that it can be exercised by moving your body.

5 reproductions

The rabbit gives birth to its young, usually 4 to 10 rabbits are born. At birth they are hairless and completely blind.
