The animal world in the Pirin Mountains

There is a great wealth of animal species. More than 2000 species and subspecies of invertebrates (spiders, centipedes, insects, snails) and almost 250 species of vertebrates are known. Of the latter, birds (177 species) and mammals (45 species) predominate, and fish are only 6 species. Many of these animals are endangered and need special protection - bald eagle, three-toed woodpecker, mountain mullet, spinytailed tortoise. The most common are chamois, deer, bear, wolf, fox, eagle, falcon, capercaillie and others.





Edelweiss

The Edelweiss flower is one of the symbols of Bulgaria. From Latin its name Leontopodium means "Lion's Paw", and translated from German - "noble white" (Edew - noble, weiss - white). It belongs to the genus of perennial herbaceous plants of the family Compositae. About 30 species are popular worldwide, but in Bulgaria only one species grows, which is found in Pirin and Stara Planina.



Pirin poppy

Another of the distinctive plants in the Pirin Mountains. Its Latin name is Papaver degenii.

Perennial herbaceous tuft plant. Its stems are 5 to 15 cm high. It differs from other poppies in the main leaves and color of the petals - Pirin poppy is the only Bulgarian species with yellow or orange petals.

It is distributed only in Pirin. The species is protected and is included in the Red Book of Bulgaria.
