James Naismith was a Canadian-American physical educator sports coach and innovator. He invented the sport of basketball in 1891. He wrote the original basketball rulebook, founded the University of Kansas basketball program, and lived to see basketball adopted as an Olympic demonstration sport in 1904 and as an official event at the 1936 Summer Olympics in Berlin, as well as the birth of both the National Invitation Tournament (1938) and the NCAA Men's Division I Basketball Championship (1939).



Tony Hinkle is known as the 'inventor' of the present basketballs in the late 1950s. He also came up with the "Hinkle System" offense strategy, based on a complex system of motion, passes, picks and screens; it was adopted by many of the over 200 high school and college coaches trained by Hinkle.

Experience that was helpful for a girl through this sport:

Many kids through basketball, succeed in improving *special personal situations that affect their lives.

Chiara, for example, started to practice this sport because of a friend of hers.

She managed to identify her personality and her character thanks to her union within the team, and has succeeded also to overcome, growing up, her discomfort in being together with other people and to show her skills, all this thanks to team-mates who have always supported her in her weakness moments . Talking to Chiara, now, we can notice the change that has occurred, listening to her more responsible speeches and seeing how more self-confident and aware of her progresses she is.

This experience has made us understand the union and force that is within this sport and that we should not convince ourselves not to be able to do things because every sickness has a remedy. As in sport the obstacle that is placed by the opposing team is defeated by the union and force of the team, this is a relevant teaching in the growth of the boys also for a constructive future in society.

Apart building shoulders and resistance to stress, it helps those who practice (either adult or child he may be) in the aspects that concern:

- Socialization
- Discipline and seriousness
- Development of a healthy competition (that helps all players to improve.)
- Possibility to vent
- Ability to perform a role, eliminating Individualism, so that everyone plays and perform her/his role with the aim of improving: so that they develop a collaborative and efficient.
