

ROMANIA'S NATIONAL DAY

On December 1, 1918, the National Assembly of Romanians of Transylvania and Hungary, consisting of 1,228 elected representatives of the Romanians in Transylvania, Banat, Crișana and Maramureș, convened in Alba Iulia and decreed:

" the unification of these Romanians and all of the territories inhabited by them with Romania. "



On December 11, 1918, King Ferdinand signed the law regarding the Union of Transylvania, Banat, Crișana, the Satmar and Maramureș, with the Old Kingdom of Romania, decreeing that

The lands named in the resolution of the Alba-Iulia National Assembly of the 18th November 1918 are and remain forever united with the kingdom of Romania.

The first December 1 national holiday saw the largest celebrations in Alba-Iulia, the location in which the union of Transylvania with Romania was signed.
