

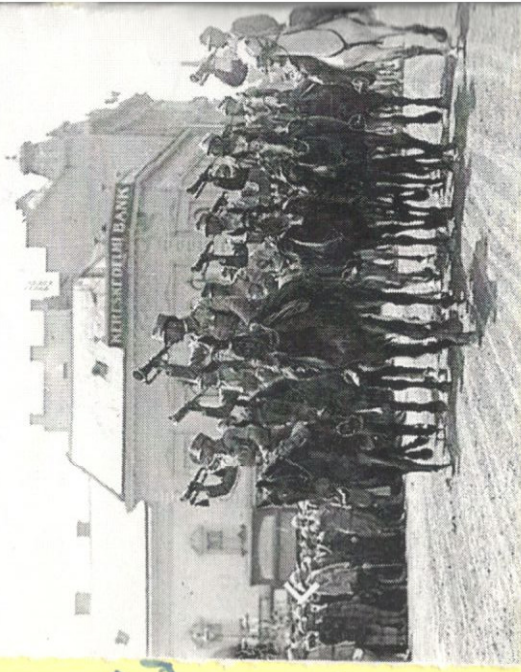
(The Bărăbotoș area) went to Bulgaria.

### Aba Iulia National Assembly

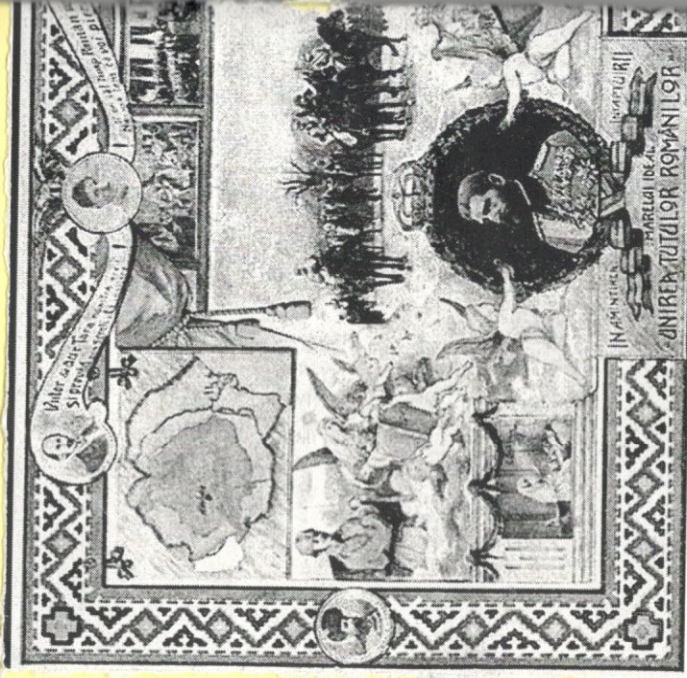
On December 1, 1918, the National Assembly of Romanians of Transylvania in Hungary, consisting of 1228 elected representatives of the Romanians in Transylvania, Banat, Crișana and Maramureș, convened in Aba Iulia and decreed (by unanimous vote)

"the unification of these Romanians and of all the territories inhabited by them with Romania."

Romanian Post Card issued ca. 1918-1919.
