#### **Customer service**

Finnish customer service is maby little more strict. Austrian payment methods are different specially in coffeehouses, you pay when you leave. When in Finland you usually pay when you order.

Austrians don't often speak english, even near Vienna's tourist attractions. So when

you try to talk to them in English, they flee.

Finnish customer service is usually more polite and helpful compared to Austrian.

There are differences. In Finland there is more self-service. In Austria waitresses and waiters serve the customers e.g. in restaurants.

In Finland people serves clients in many different languages. In Austria, as a rule, are served only in German. Also the customer servants are generally more friendly in Finland, than in Austria.

#### Culture
