Kindergarten

Age: 3-5

Information: It is optional, pupils wear aprons to school, they start their English education.



Primary school

Age: 6-10

Information: It is obligatory, pupils wear school uniforms (boys wear the same uniform as the girls).



Secondary school

Age: 11-13

Information: It is obligatory.



High school

Age: 14-19

Information: It is obligatory, has different levels.



University or a degree

Duration: Depends on the study

Information: Is optional.

Age: 4-5 : It is optional

Age: 12-16

Information: It is obligatory

HAVO (Senior general secondary education)

Age: 12-17

Information: Is obligatory

VWO (Pre-university education)

Age: 12-18
