and


5 overseas departments

The most famous French are the landing beaches and the dune of Pilat.











Nature in painting The Normandy coastline was a favourite with France's Impressionist painters, particularly Etretat which has been depicted in many Monet paintings. Étretat is part of the Alabaster coast, known for its dramatic white cliffs.
