The film *Wonder* is a comedydrama directed by Stephen Chbosky and written by Jack Thorne, Steven Conrad and Stephen Chbosky. It is based on the R.J. Palacio novel *Wonder*. It first appeared in American movie theatres in 2017 and is now available on DVD. The main actors are Julia Roberts, Owen Wilson, Jacob Tremblay and Izabela Vidovic, who represent the Pullman family around whom the story evolves.

The film introduces us to August Pullman, who suffers from a genetic abnormality called 'Treacher Collins Syndrome' which is characterized by deformities of the face. He has been homeschooled by his mom for a long time because of his health condition and his numerous operations. Now for the first time in his young life he has to go to an "actual" school where we see him struggling to fit in.

What I liked best about this film is the fact that we see the plot developing through the eyes of different characters (Auggie, Miranda, Via, ...). It helps us understand what is going on and learn about the characters' feelings and thoughts. As for instance, we experience Auggie's first day of school both from Auggie's and from Via's perspective. I like this narrative technique because it makes you understand how the two characters live the same day differently and realize that there are always two sides to a story. I was also impressed by the precepts Mr. Browne gives the pupils during the story. One of the precepts says: "When given the choice between being right or being kind, choose kind." In my opinion this is a very substantial way of making decisions in life.

The music/soundtrack has also been chosen very well because it underlines the characters' feelings in the different scenes. Moreover, the acting is so powerful and natural that the audience gets the impression of actually being part of the story.

I would really recommend watching the film *Wonder* because of the topics it exposes, like bullying and having to cope with being different. It's really a film for people of all ages. Don't miss it!

He quickly finds a nice, kind and funny friend called Jack who distracts him from this one boy Julian who makes his school life complicated.

The film is very emotional especially because of Auggie's disease and the resulting consequences for him and his family. It is touching to see how a 10 year old boy keeps going forward and strengthens his self-confidence despite the way other people look at him. The fact that the director tells the story from different points of view makes the film even more interesting, because we can see various characters live the same situations differently. As for example, when the whole Pullman family accompany Auggie to his first day of school, we see it from both Auggie's and Via's perspective.

The language in the film is very easy to understand even if English isn't your mother tongue[.] Another thing I appreciated were Mr[.] Browne's monthly precepts because they give us a hint of what Auggie is feeling in these situations[.]

All those special camera shots help the audience see the characters' emotions. I liked the close-up shots because they allow you to focus on the character's facial expression, for instance when Auggie overhears the other boys of his class speaking evil of him. The acting is very convincing, especially in the case of Jacob Tremblay who had to embody a disabled boy. As for the music used in the film, I think the producers did a good job. They always put in the right music at the right moment, so it makes the audience sympathize emotionally with the characters, as for example in the scene where Miranda is standing outside the window watching the Pullman family celebrate Christmas.

The movie is absolutely worth watching because it touches your heart to see a little boy defending himself like a big boy. It's a film for the whole family and I highly recommend it!

Isabel home-schooled him until the fifth grade, then his parents decide that he should go to a private middle school. First, the other students stare at him and annov him, but soon he gets to know Jack Will and he becomes his first friend at school. This friendship will prove during the film. But the story is not only told from Auggie's point of view. Some chapters are told by Jack Will, Auggie's friend, by Via or by Miranda, Via's friend. It makes the film even more interesting.

The actors make the film authentic and realistic. They play their roles very well. Although there are not much music in the film, the camera shots make the film more exciting, because the different shots, like the medium shot in the scene when Auggie get to know the first children in his school or close-up shot in the moment where Auggie is born and the mother realized that something is wrong, are selected in the perfect moments to feel with. The costumes are the correct choice, and I think the mask of Jacob Tremblay looks so real that nobody expects that it is a mask. The film was nominated for many awards and won 3: The Truly Moving Picture Award, the Hochi Film Award and the Saturn Award for the Best Independent Film.

"Wonder" is a must! The film shows the life of a child who is not "normal" in our eyes, but it shows not only the problems of people like Auggie, it shows the views and emotions of those who surround him, too. Another reason why I absolutely loved this movie was the evolution of Auggie's self-confidence. At the beginning, he always denigrates himself. He even wears an astronaut helm to hide his face and to avoid being judged. As the film progresses, his new friends help him to feel accepted. August develops his self-confidence and by the end of "Wonder", he finally accepts himself.
