

EVALUATION C2, mobility in Poland – 28.03-01.04.2022
(LTA – Learning and Training Activities hosted by the Katolickie Liceum Ogólnokształcące im. Romualda Traugutta w Chojnicach, located in the town of Chojnice)

Participants:

- pupils from Poland and their teachers.
- 2 students from Norway and two teachers,
- 2 students from Portugal and two teachers,
- 6 students from France and a teacher.

The group from Italy could not make it to this mobility due to national health constraints.

Activities carried out:

- 1) - Discovery of the school, the city and the local way of life.
 - Solidarity concert with Ukraine (singer Hanna Tiekuczewa, Ukrainian living in Poland for several years).
 - Discovery of the city of Gdansk, capital of the Pomerania region, in the northwest of Poland. Visit of the Solidarity Museum and meeting with former President Lech Walesa.
 - Visit of the city of Chojnice and its surroundings, with a barbecue at a famous touristic resort nearby, as well as a guided tour of the local churches with explanations about their different styles.
 - 2) Around the main subject of the week, theatre.
 - Evaluation (with Kahoot) in the national theaters of the 5 partner countries of this project.
 - Workshops led by professionals.
- Historical dances and plays performed in costumes, with the participation of pupils (and teachers).
The students also had the task of designing a small play from the writing of the text to the staging, then presenting their work in front of an audience.

Evaluation:

The week was rich in activities and the participants were constantly solicited. The relevance of this mobility is undeniable, the students would not have been able to play their pieces remotely. The organization was exemplary and the implementation of the various activities, both at the level of the workshops in the school and for the outings and visits was of high quality. The organizing team of this mobility was very effective and efficient. The impact of this mobility is strong for the students present, but the sharing with students from distant high schools was also rich. The participants brought back photos and videos of the activities carried out and their mates were able to discover part of the Polish culture, as well as the discovery of the theatrical staging. The fact that it is told by their mates brings a stronger impact as well.
