Democracy is a system of government in which laws, policies, leadership, and major undertakings of a state or other polity are directly or indirectly decided by the "people," a group historically constituted by only a minority of the population (e.g., all free adult males in ancient <u>Athens</u> or all sufficiently propertied adult males in 19th-century Britain) but generally understood since the mid-20th century to include all (or nearly all) adult citizens.



MODERN DEMOCRACY

- Democracy as we know it today has taken shape over the centuries.
- Modern democracy was born in the 18th century and is the result of the actions of philosophers such as Montesquieu, J.J. Rousseau, John Locke
- They laid the foundations for the first modern law: civil rights, constitutions
