Castle Street: On Castle Street, the Market Cross symbolizes the medieval market right with the Scottish unicorn. The portrait medal on the city cross erected in 1686 shows the Stuart monarchs from Jacob I to Maria Stuart.

Old Aberdeen: Just over three kilometers to the north lies the cobblestone old town on the banks of the River Don. It had its own market right until the 19th century. Today, the listed district with buildings from 1641 is the preferred meeting place for students.

Duthie Park: South of the harbor, the Deeufer follows Riverside Drive to Duthie Park. Here you will find one of Europe's largest winter gardens and flower gardens, including a hill alone for roses and a garden for the blind.

Victoria Park: In the middle of Watson Street park, there is a fountain made of 14 different types of granite
