The third meeting in our project was held in Sweden in Landvetter and Mölnlycke in Harryda municipality.

For three preschool teachers from Stockholm the week started with two days of job shadowing, 14 – 15 of March.

## The project meeting started 16<sup>th</sup> of Mars in Agnebacken preschool in Landvetter.

Annika Gry welcomed the participants



Paula Bergström, Anna Wesslau and Heidi Järveläinen presented the digital tool called Pluttra, which is used in the preschools in Harryda municipality for the pedagogical documentation.

Annika had a discussion about norm critical approach and made also a norm critical exersice.

After lunch the group visited Hagen preschool where Veronica Strand informed about the outdoor activities, e g the big and small building area.

Then a short walk to Salmereds preschool where Erika Grindberg Bentley showed the outdoor area.







Then the group went to NAVET science Center in Boras. Harryda municipality, and specially the preschools, cooperate with NAVET with, among other things, further training for the preschool staff.





At NAVET the teachers had a small lecture about the ideas that had made the Science Center and also showed how they work with science with the preschool children.

An interesting link in the renewing work at Navet has been a big study about children's and pupils thoughts about science and other school questions. The study is called ROSE, The Relevance Of Science Education, http://roseproject.no/.


The evening ended with a dinner at NAVET.

Also the second day of the project started at Agnebacken preschool and with presentations from the other preschools about what has been discussed and done since the last meeting in Stockholm according to the project.



Giliola Belli and Simon Armini reported some good and some not so good examples of how preschool teachers can react in situations of stereotypical behaviour. ("The path is still very loong!")





Anders Szpigler and Kristian Wallin informed about how they have changed the top balcony of the preschool and Sarah All and Josefin Gavsten talked about how they have worked with books with the focus of norm breaking thoughts.

Áki Arnasson reflected from an observation of a test situation when their children in groups of girls, of boys and in mixed groups were offered stereotypical playing tool.

Anette Hellman, from University of Gothenburg held a lecture about her research in preschools. The lecture's name is *Food and eating, space and norms* (The lecture is possible to see if you use a link that can be found at the project website.)



After the lecture the group moved to AterC. AterC is a recycling center in Molnlycke that is a resource for the preschools and schools in Harryda Municipality.

Siv Jirblom and Helene Lindgren had a lecture about "The material's importance for learning"
