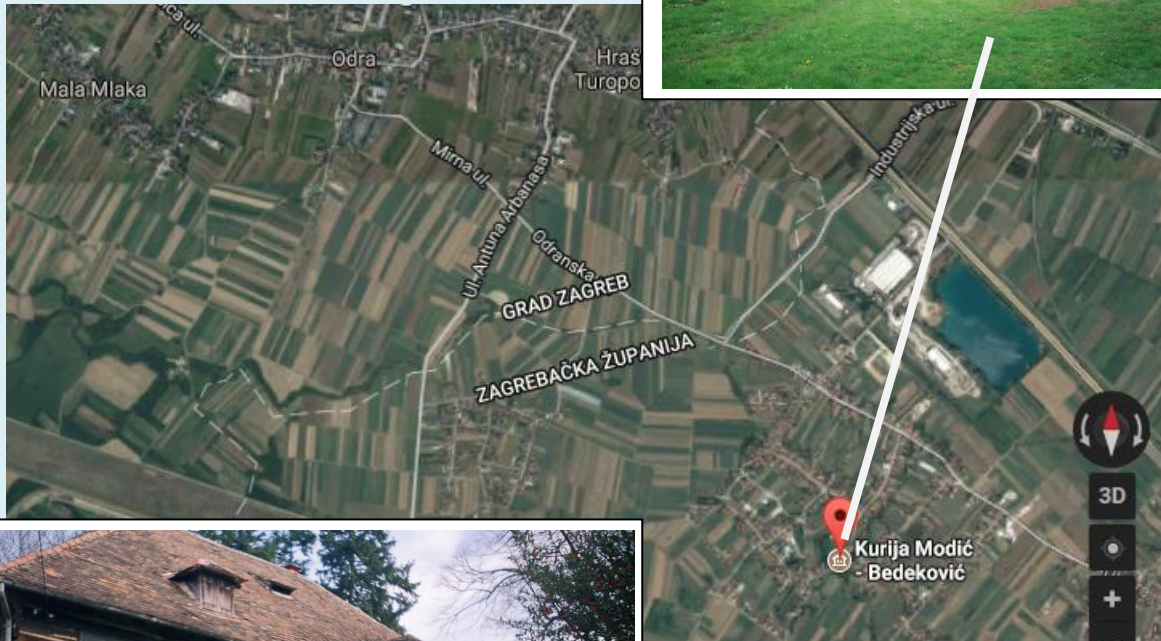


The Modić-Bedeković Manor House (kurija Modić-Bedeković), Donja Lomnica

Basic characteristic:

- *Kurija* is an old Croatian name for a manor house of the local nobility (higher class)
- The manor house was raised in 1806 by Petar Modić and will continue to stay in the family (today the Perak and Kallay family).



Detailed characteristic of the place:

- The *kurija* was built in a traditional way, made of wood beams.
- The wood beams or planks used for the walls are connected in the so-called Croatian angle (the ends of beams were left untrimmed).
- The ground floor of the house is an economic part, and the ground floor is a residential part (sleeping and eating rooms).
- Many famous people in Croatian history visited *kurija* during the time (August Šenoa and Antun Gustav Matoš).
- The last inhabitants who lived in *kurija* Modić-Bedeković was twin sisters Milka and Vilma Bedeković.
