






THE LOUVRE MUSEUM

The Louvre Museum, founded in 1775-1776 by the Count of Angivillier, Director General of the King's Buildings, then inaugurated in 1793 under the name of the Central Museum of the Arts of the Republic in the Louvre Palace, a former royal residence located in the center of Paris, is today the largest museum of art and antiques in the world. Its exhibition area is 72,735 m.

At the end of 2016, its collections included 554,731 works. These present the Western art of the Middle Ages to 1848, that of the ancient civilizations that preceded and influenced (Eastern, Egyptian, Greek, and Roman), the arts of the early Christians and Islam.





THE JOCONDE

Of course, the most famous museum is the Mona Lisa. The Mona Lisa, or Portrait of Mona Lisa is a painting of the artist Leonardo da Vinci, made between 1503 and 1519, which represents a half-body portrait, probably that of the Florentine Lisa Gherardini, wife of Francesco del Giocondo.
