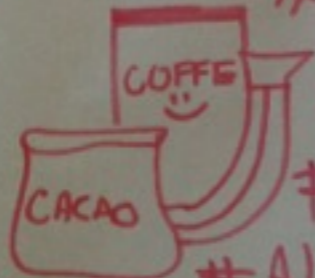
- 1. Fair Trade is an international movement to improve the living of the producers. It's an organization that wants to help people who don't have access to basic needs.
