# Summer is...

Summer is the warmest season. It lasts from the summer solistice until the next equinox. For this reason, the days at the start of summer are the longest and the nights are the shortest. At the end of summer, thus at the beginning of autumn, day and night are of equal

#### "JUGO" – "BURA" – "MAESTRAL"

Summer in Croatia is mainly associated with the appearance of clear and dry weather and fire activities become more common in the south of Croatia.

Onshore in the the coastal area the occurance of the "Jugo" (warm and moist air blowing from the southeast) which brings rainfall during summer is rare as well as the strong, gale-force coastal wind "Bura" (dry and cold wind blowing from the northeast). More frequent in the coastal area is the "Maestral" (blowing from the north-east and west, softening the summer sultriness)







## Geomorphological parts of Croatia

- There are **three** geomorphological parts of Croatia:
- 1. the Croatian lowlands
- 2. the Croatian plains
- 3. the Adriatic Sea mainland coastal area of Croatia.



## Climate

- **Lowland Croatia** has a predomaninantly moderate, warm climate with warm summers and the average temperature for July ranging between 20°C and 22°C.
- **The Croatian plains** also have a moderate warm climate with warm and chilly summers, with some elements of continental climate, exhibiting an average temperature for July under 20°C.
- The Adriatic Sea mainland coastal area of Croatia has Mediterranean climate, is moderately warm with hot summers and average temperature for July ranging from 22°C to 26°C.




#### Average temperatures

The coastal area shows average temperatures for July ranging between 22°C and 26°C.

The continental parts of the country exhibit an average ranging between 17°C and 23°C.

On higher sea levels temperatures range between 10°C and 15°C.

Dry days with high temperatures are typical and cause damage to the agricultural sector.




# Precipitation during summer...

Precipitation during summer is not equally distributed, depending on the terrain and the distance from the sea.

Those parts of Croatia farthest east, some islands and parts of the coastal area have the lowest precipitation rates while higher positioned terrains show the highest precipitation rates (500 to 600 mm).

The lack of rainfall and great drought cause problems in the agricultural sector in areas where irrigation is not possible. Great droughts typically bring about wildfires which are frequent in the coastal area.





## Wildfires during summer

- The lack of rainfall leads to drought.
- High temperatures foster great wildfires which are frequently started on purpose by irresponsible individuals.

# Wildjires in 2017

- The coastal area of Croatia was affected by a series of wildfires in 2017.
- The damages were substantial and the second biggest city in Croatia, Split, was under threat.
