Trastevere is located on the west bank of the Tiber. Its name comes from the Latin Tiberim, literally beyond the river.

With the wealth of the Imperial Age, several important figures decided to build their villas in Trastevere, including Clodia and Julius Caesar. This rione includes two of the most ancient churches in Rome: Basilica di Santa Maria in Trastevere and Basilica di Santa Cecilia in Trastevere.



The streets at the beginning were formed by bricks but these were replaced by sampietrini





Nowadays, Trastevere maintains its ancient characters thanks to its narrow cooled streets lined by ancient houses. The neighbourhood has attracted artist, foreign expats, and many famous people.
