

The Triumph of Bacchus is a Roman mosaic that was created around the 2nd or 3rd century A.D. It was found in Zaragoza in 1908 and it depicts the triumph of the god Bacchus. The mosaic is a part of a larger piece that has representations of the four seasons. Bacchus is the Latin version of the Greek god Dionysus. Also depicted in the mosaic is a figure of a satyr that alludes to Ampelos, a winged and crowned Victory, and the god Pan. The mosaic is currently being preserved in the National Archaeological Museum of Madrid.
