

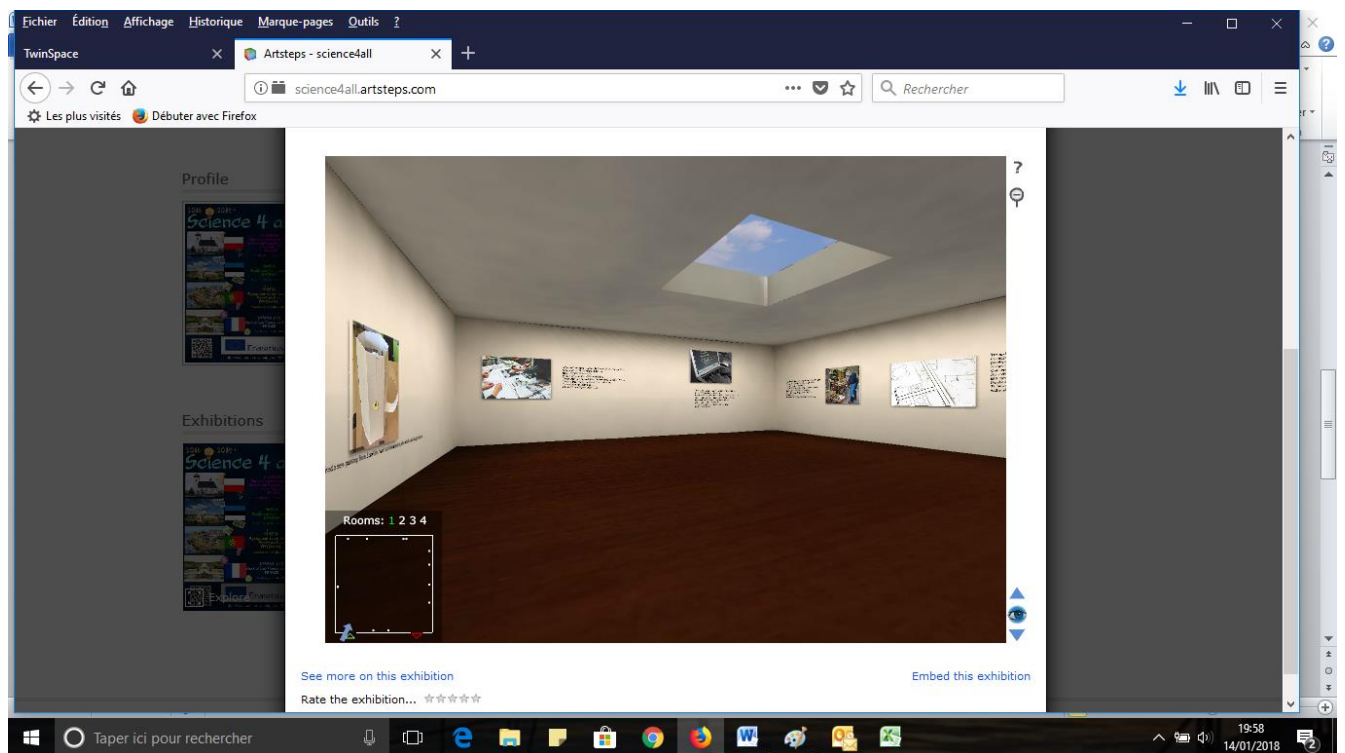

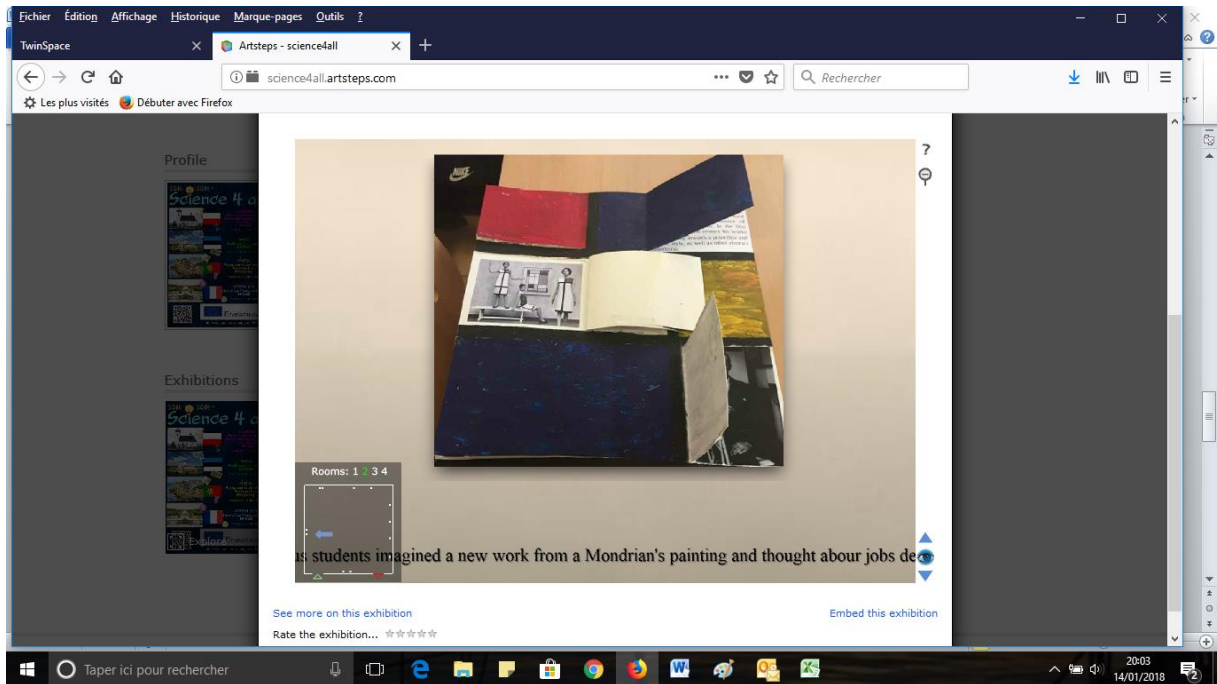
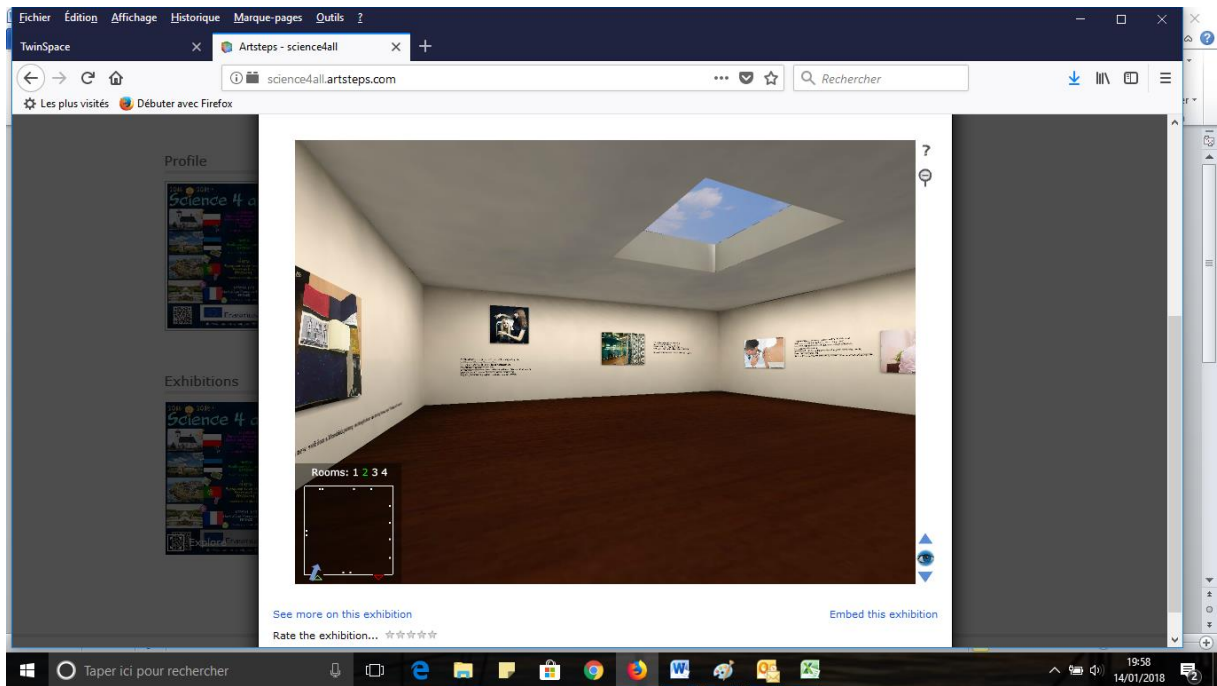
## The computer programmer

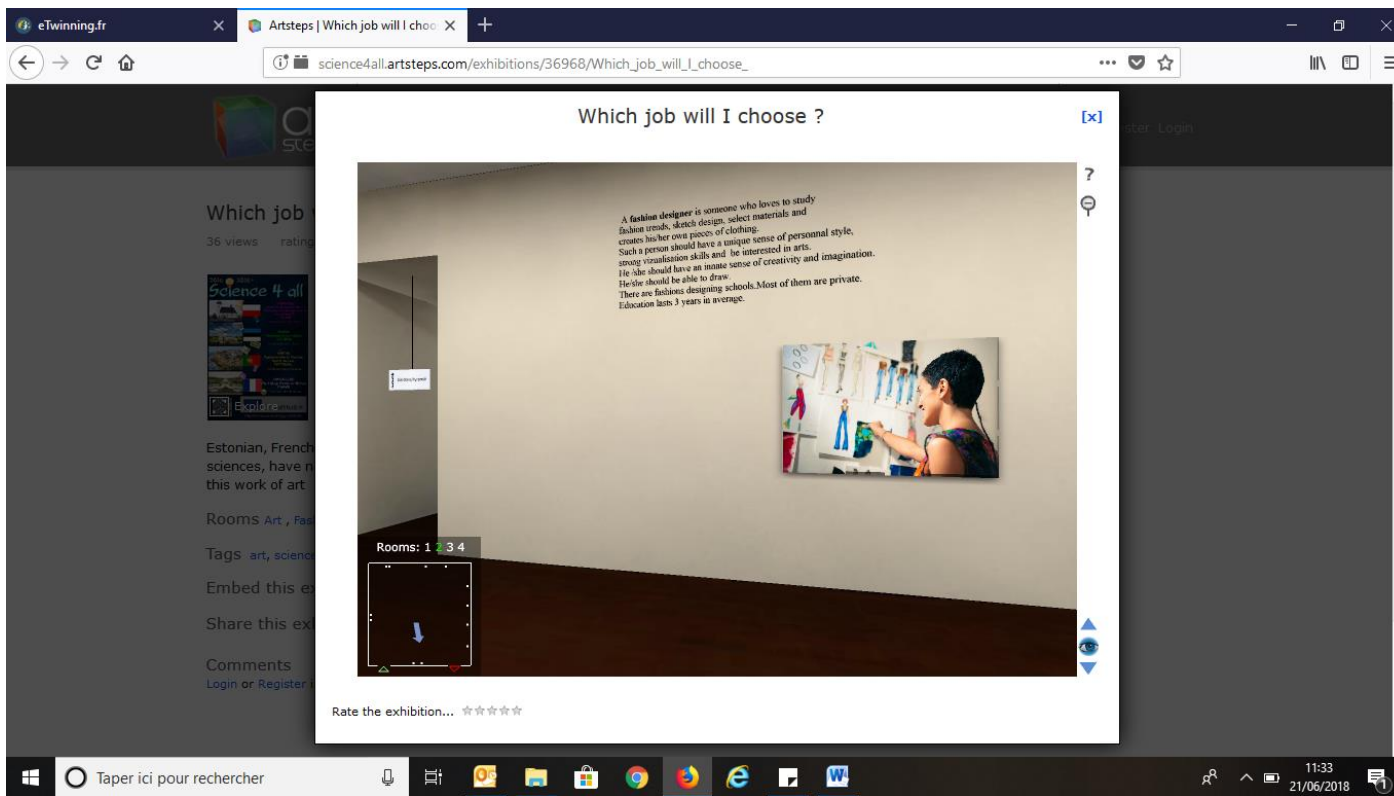

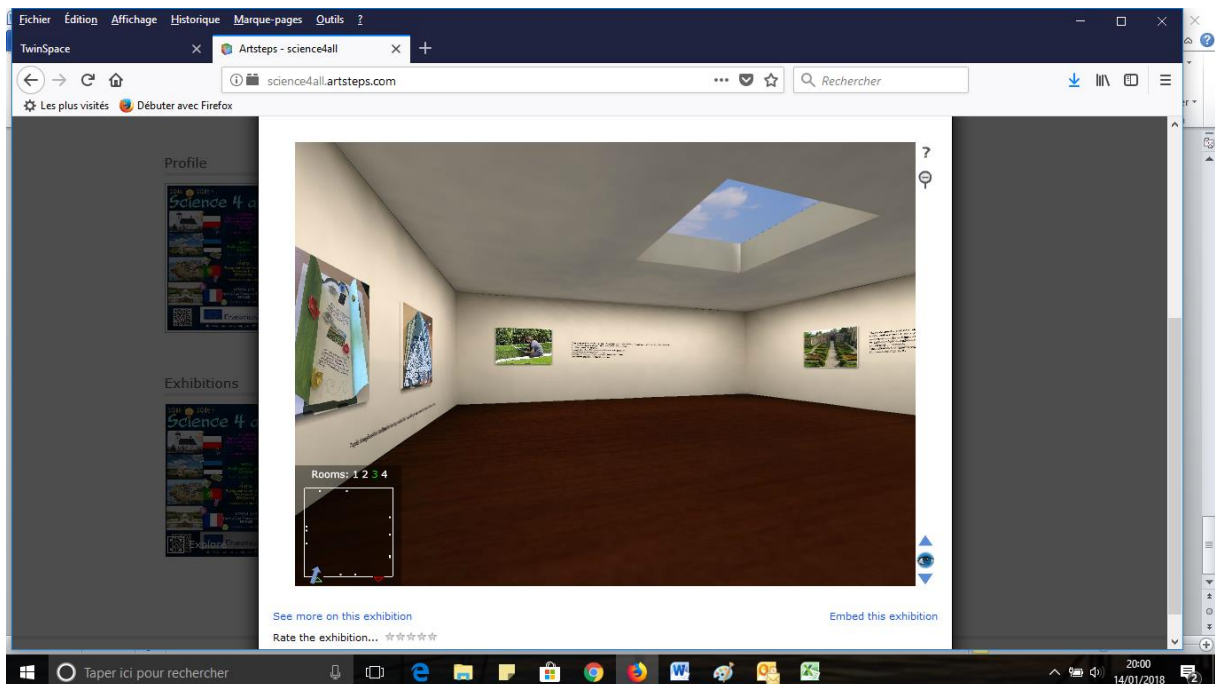

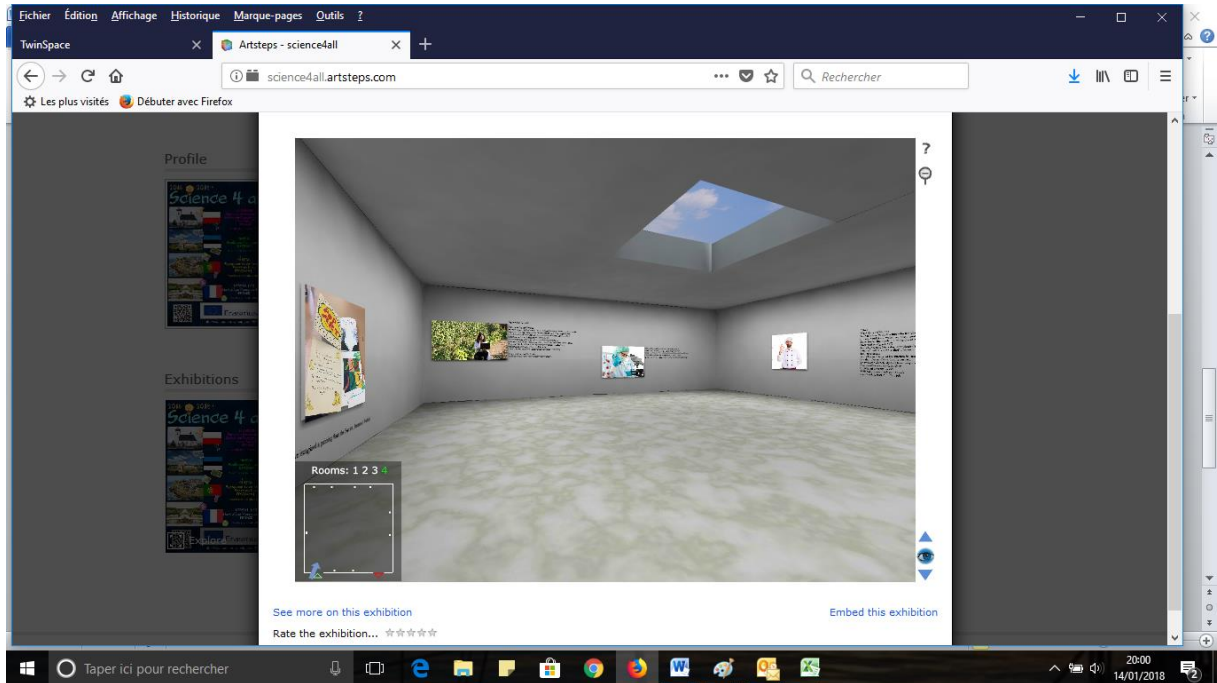
## The glass blower

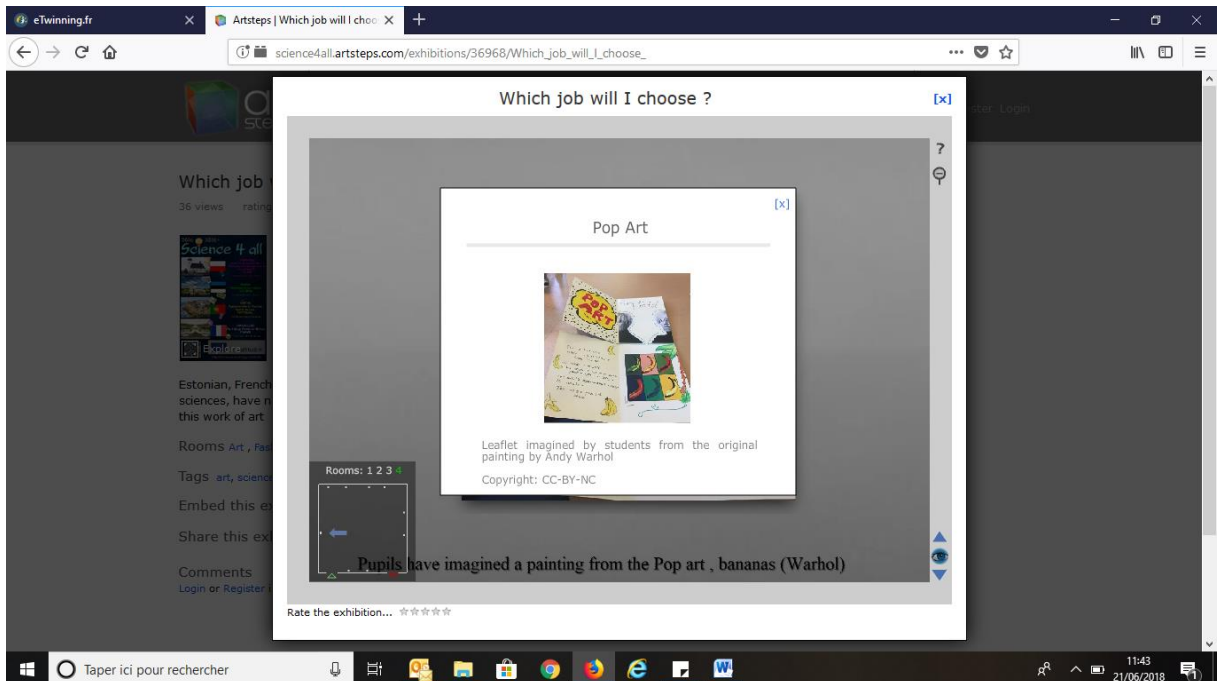
