

Modal verbs rules (ability)

- 1. We use 'can/could' to express typical situations or behavior
 - It can be difficult to find a summer job
- 2. We use 'can/be able to' for present and future ability
 - Many children can type before they can write
- 3. We use 'can' for the future where there is a sense of opportunity

- They can visit the museum while they're here
- 4. We use 'could/couldn't' and 'was/were able to' to talk about general past ability
 - I couldn't swim until I was 10 years old
- 5. We use 'could/couldn't' + perfect infinitive to talk about unfulfilled ability in the past
 - I could have learnt to ski but I preferred skating
