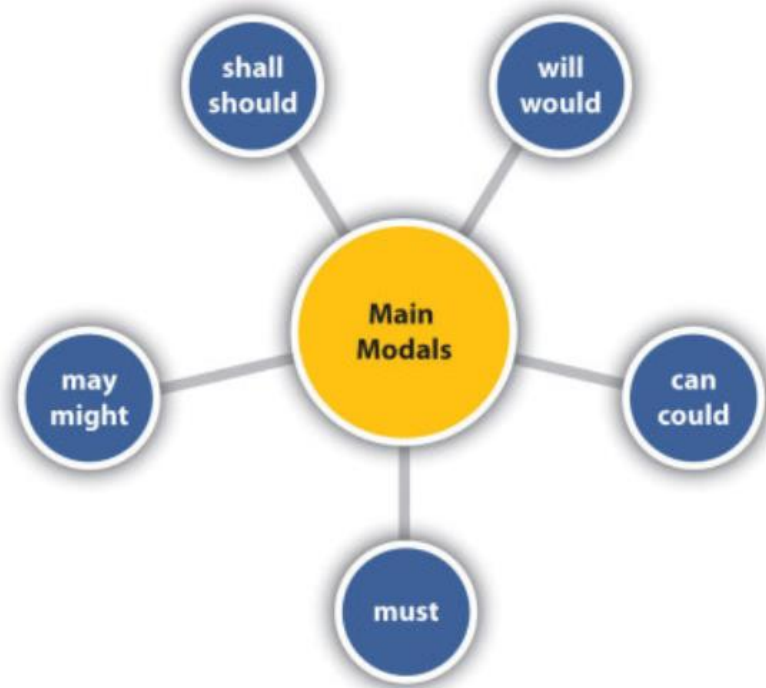

Modal verbs rules (ability)

1. We use '**can/could**' to express **typical situations** or **behavior**
 - It can be difficult to find a summer job
2. We use '**can/be able to**' for **present and future ability**
 - Many children can type before they can write
3. We use '**can**' for the future where there is a **sense of opportunity**

- They can visit the museum while they're here
4. We use '**could/couldn't**' and '**was/were able to**' to talk about **general past ability**
 - I couldn't swim until I was 10 years old
 5. We use '**could/couldn't**' + **perfect infinitive** to talk about **unfulfilled ability in the past**
 - I could have learnt to ski but I preferred skating
