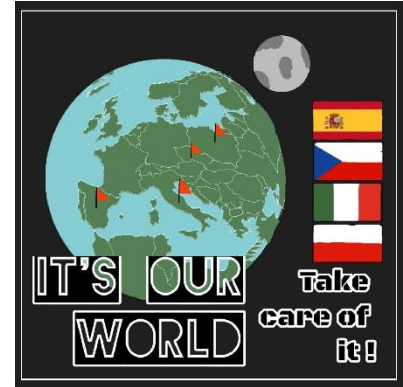

# History of women's rights in Poland

In Poland, women's right to vote were granted in 1918, mainly due to Aleksandra Piłsudska, the second wife of Józef Piłsudski, the first Polish marshal.

As a result, Poland became one of the first countries where women were granted the right to vote.





## Polish suffragettes

Polish women were one of the first European women to gain the right to vote. They came from different backgrounds, had different education, experience and political views, but they had one goal in mind - opposition to the marginalization of women in public life and their equality.

# Woman at work



Women perform some of the most important functions, such as nursing and education.

The gender division is gradually blurring - no one is surprised that a woman trains boxing and a man works as a nurse.



# Successful women

Maria Skłodowska Curie, the first woman in Poland, a Nobel Prize winner and the first woman in the world in the field of physics and chemistry.

Her greatest success was the discovery of the chemical elements polonium and radium.

All over the world he became famous thanks to the development of the theory of radioactivity.



# Law to protect women

**Maternity law** - a woman is entitled to vacation from work after giving birth to a child. the break may last from 20 to 52 weeks

**Paternity law** - the father is entitled to 2 weeks of leave. can use them until the child reaches 2 years of age



In divorce, each case is considered individually, but as a rule, the child is awarded to the **mother**.

# Gender violence

Violence directed against people because of their back affects both women and men in Poland. To prevent such behavior, a “Blue Line” has been opened where you can report acts of violence, for example at home.



The problem is sufficiently developed and difficult for society to solve.



# Mafia ruled by a woman

Crimes and responsibility for them are not divided into gender, the only thing that differs is the motive of action and category, for example crimes such as beatings, burglaries and murders are more often committed by men, which does not exclude interference by women the best example of this is Magdalena Kralka, the head of the Cracow mafia, who has a very large influence on crime in Poland.

Patryk Vega, as one of the most popular film directors in Poland, included Magda in one of his films about the Polish mafia. These productions have become one of the most watched films.



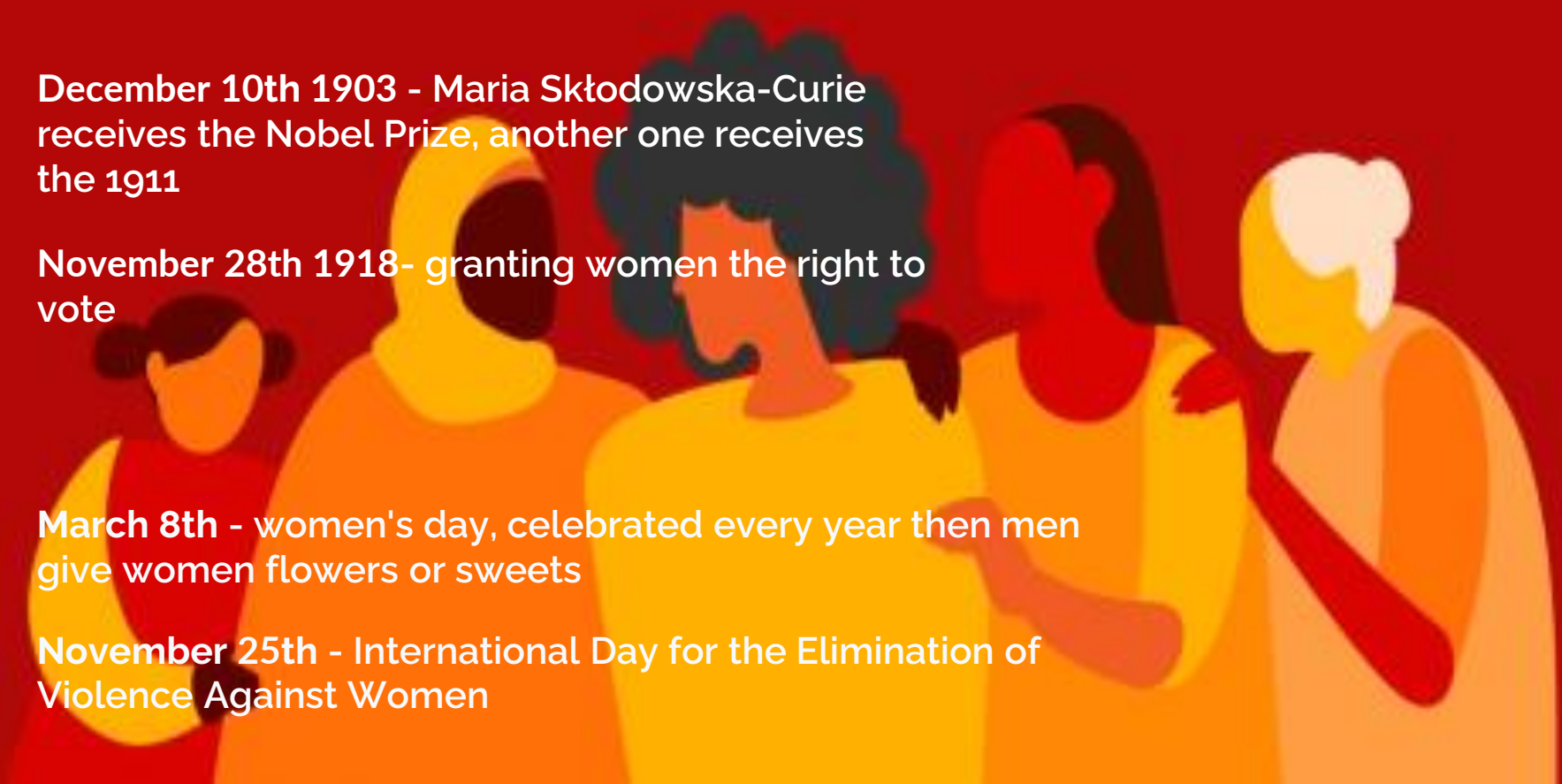
# Relevant dates related to woman
