A few words about the work

"Shumi Maritsa" is the national anthem of Bulgaria from 1886 to 1944 . The original text of the song was written by Nikola Zhivkov, head teacher during the Renaissance. After many variants, the last edition of Ivan Vazov from 1912 remains.

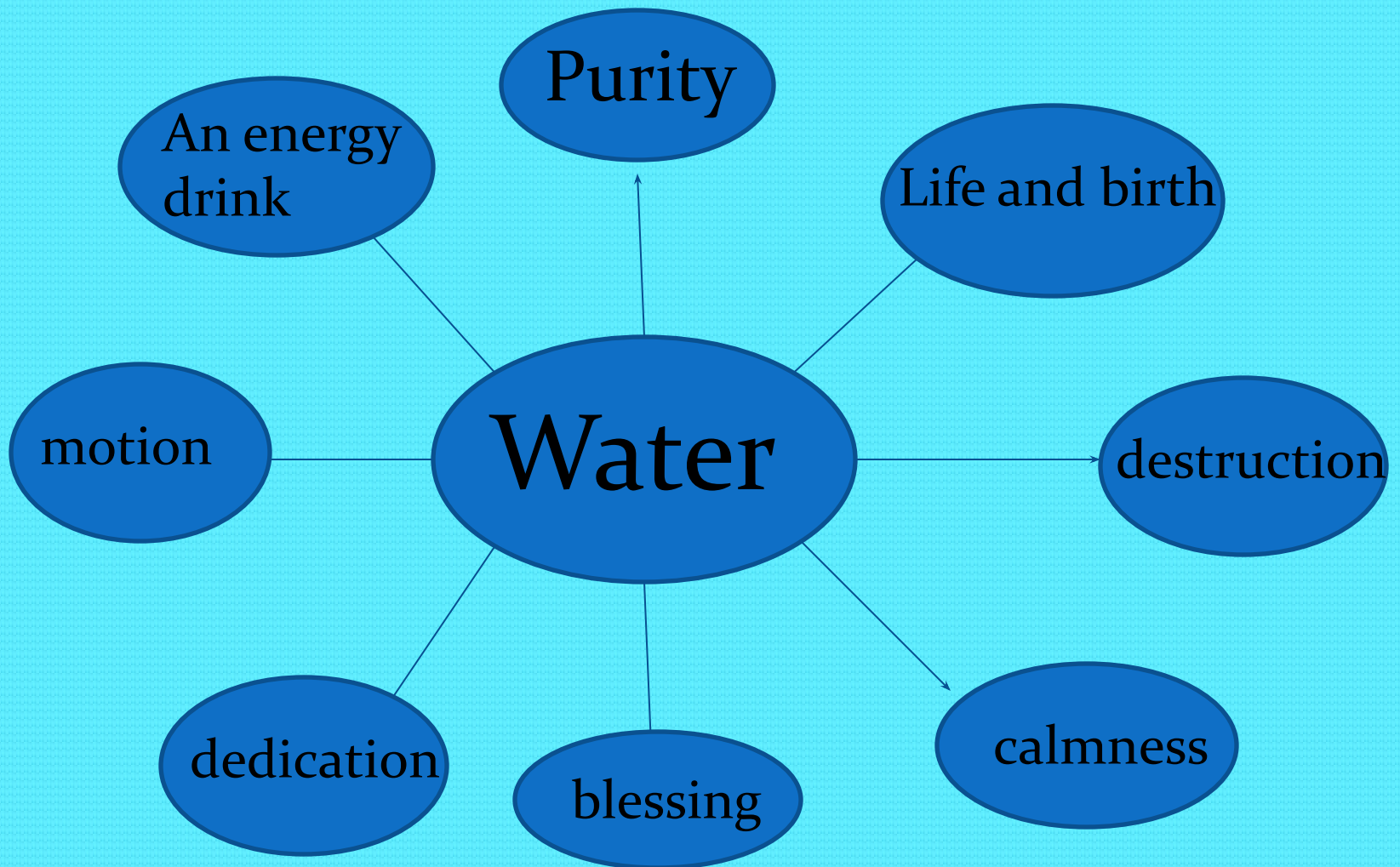


The role of the water in text

● The very text of "Shumi Maritsa" is extremely influential and gives a clear idea of the hallmarks of those years, while managing to sing at the same time the tragedy and greatness of a nation. It is unlikely that there is another national anthem in which **the river**, instead of water, has blood in its bed, the widow cries, but the general does not stop.



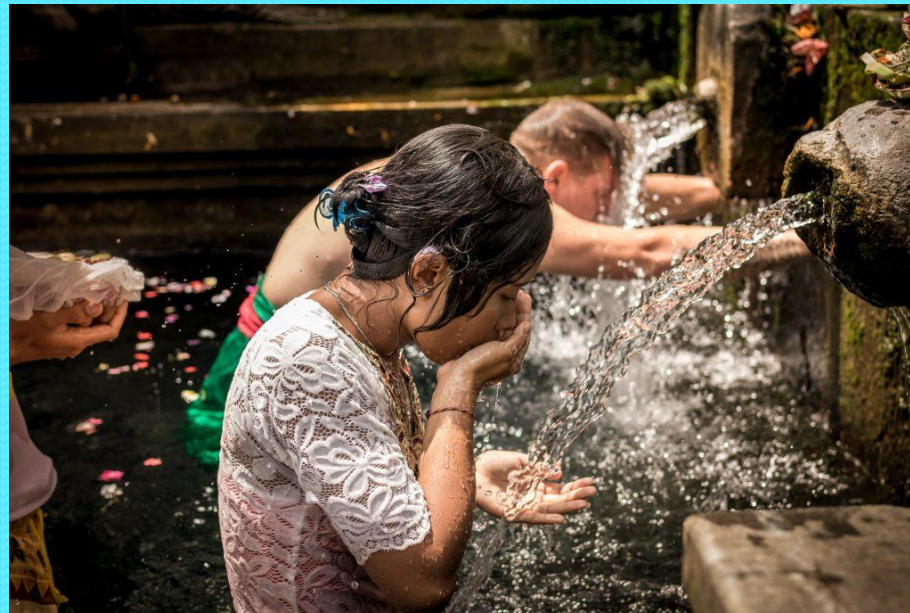
What can the water mean?
