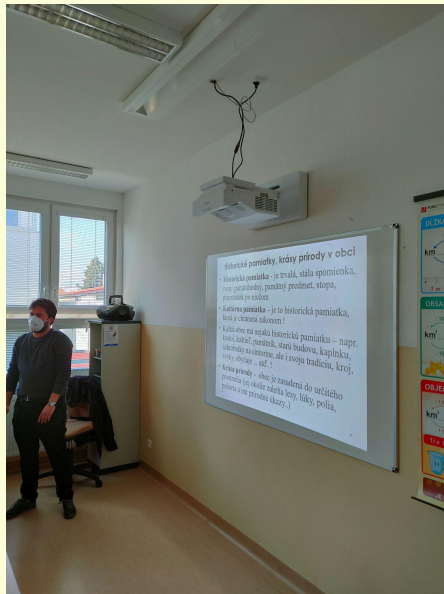
The official welcome

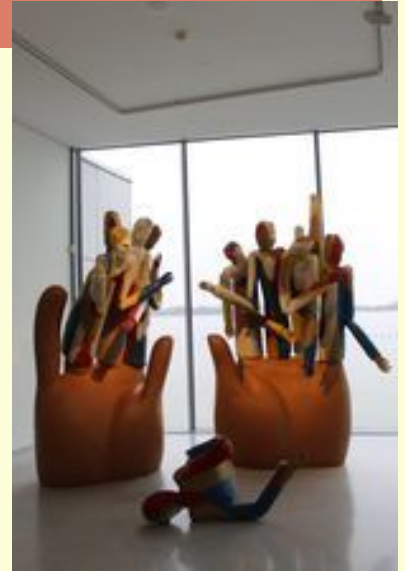
# Monday-5th April

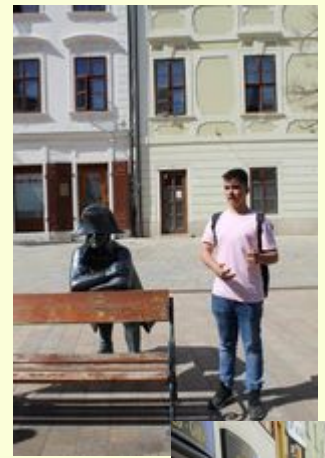


# Here is a part of our task:

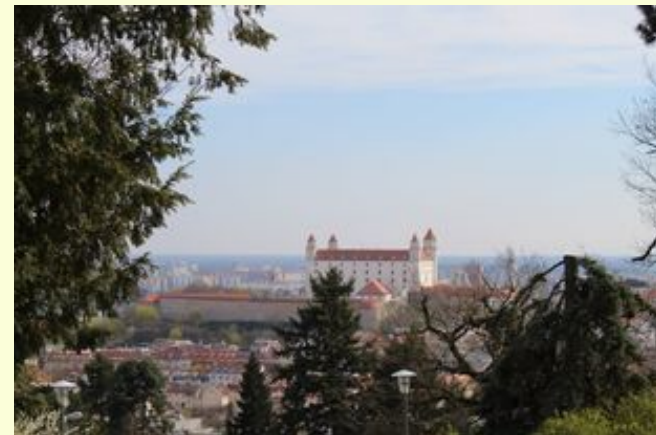


Here we saw a man who had disguised himself as one of the bronze sculptures.





Later, we were impressed by the gardens and the Bratislava Castle, which offered spectacular views of the capital and the quiet white Danube.





# Wednesday- 6th April

During the third day of the project, we visited interesting destinations. The first place of the day was "Devin Castle" (The Castle of the Virgin) dating back to Roman times and over the years it has been ruled by different nations such as the Saxoburgs in the 13th century and each ruler has rebuilt and added something to the castle. In the 18th century it was destroyed by Napoleon and for that nowadays we only see remains. The fortress is actually the border with Austria, only a river separates them and across the river is Austria. During the socialist period many people tried to swim across the river to escape to Austria but were killed by the local soldiers. Slovakia was the first socialist country to secede from Czechoslovakia in 1993.





Millions of years ago, there was a sea on the site of the fortress and that is why we still see dinosaur footprints, dinosaur fossils and artifacts from the primitive civilizations here. But the most interesting thing is that in the 9th century, the brothers Cyril and Methodius settled, created and spread the Slavic script. There is even a small Orthodox church here in their honour. We were very proud when the tour guide mentioned Cyril and Methodius and felt truly Bulgarian.







The next visit was to the "Slavin War Memorial" where over 7000 soldiers died during the Second World War. The memorial is located on one of the highest hills in the city and from there you can see wonderful views of all parts of Bratislava.





Although we were endlessly tired from the long day, dinner followed for all the teachers and students at a nearby mall to explore.

# Thursday-4th April

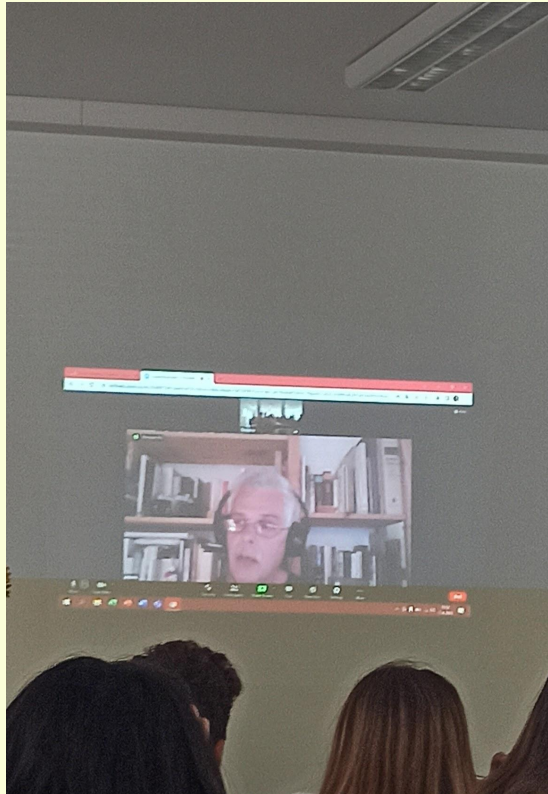
The morning started with sports activities in international groups as one of the themes of the project is sports. At the end, the winners received medals made of traditional Slovak chocolate.





After lunch we were divided into groups, one of which worked with old photos we had brought and made posters with photos from all the countries participating in the project. The others made lucky bracelets. At the end we organised an exhibition with the finished products.





We also had an online (zoom) meeting with the renowned Greek photographer Professor Antonis Zivas, to whom we asked the questions we (the students from all participating countries) had prepared in advance. As some of the groups were leaving on Friday, a farewell international dinner was organized at the school on that day, each country had brought something traditional from their cuisine.

# Friday-8th April

On the last day, all the students divided into two groups. First, we all went together to the chemistry room on the second floor of the school and the Slovak students presented their project based on water.





After the presentation, the two groups split up, with one group going to the gym to play games related to English and the other group going to the chemistry room and doing experiments related to water.



At the end of the day, after all the fun and emotions throughout the week, all the students ended it all with hugs and tears. We were very sad and sad, but we left smiling because it was a wonderful week.
