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4. Project Management and Implementation

Please provide an overall state of play of your project: what are the achievements of the project at this stage? Are the initial project activities and objectives being carried out and reached so far?

At the beginning of September we notified teachers and students in our school about the project. We began disseminating the project ideas to the whole teaching staff, all the schools' students and their parents and the local community. Students, prepared leaflets, brochure presentations and video about our city and school. Students had possibilities to improve their research, searching an selecting skills, cooperated with one other, using ICT tools. We held the first kick-off meeting in Germany. Activities for this meeting:

- · Presentation of our schools,
- Fix the dates for mobilities and tasks to be accomplished,
- · Organizing the eTwinning platform,
- · Creation of a web page,
- · Planning all activities in detail for the first year,
- Llaid down the rules for the logo contest for a common project logo,
- Working on the common questionnaire about migration,
- Laid out dissemination plans depending on each school schedules.
- We discussed what would be required and what we planned to do for the first LTTA to be held in Portugal.

Finally, the students of the German school held a reading of play in English: "A morning in front of Lampedusa" (by Antonio Umberto Ricco) with local media present for dissemination.

During the LTTA in the Azores Portugal, all the activities as listed in the timetable of the application were carried out. The activities in the first TTLA were:

- · The results for the official logo were announced
- The students presented their work about migrations in the past in their countries;
- The students built the migratory map showing the migration patterns of the past using pins and colors to represent each country's migrations;
- They carried out research on famous migrants and presented them;
- They studied the exhibition of all results about migrations in the past (photographs, documents, letters, testimonies, drawings, results that the Portuguese team had set up
- There was an assembly of immigrants living in Terceira island who came from different countries and talked about themselves and answered questions put to them by the students:

In addition some extra activities were carried out:

- Students danced to the song entitled "Immigration Song";
- the Portuguese presented a video on children who were sold and given away by parents to American families who lived in Terceira several years ago;
- · Each country presented and sang a song on the topic "Migrations"
- students wrote a short text and created images to build a "Shadow theatre" and these works were compiled into a video that was presented on the last day of the activities

Teachers held a meeting to confirm the activities set for the second LTTA and to discuss the progress of the project. Work progressed as planned on the timetable. Teachers were in contact frequently to assist each other and discuss activities. We had an on line meeting to monitorize the ongoing of the project.

Romanian students worked on the topic of the project:

- they visit the Archives of the town,
- they visited the Europe Direct center and discuss with a psychologist about the influence of migration on teenagers,
- they organize a Living Library and met some of their collegues that have parents migrating for a better job abroad,
- they took interviews to succesfull business people that migrate in or from Romania and realize a magazine.

During the second LTTA held in Kalamata, Greece almost all activities as listed in the timetable of the application were carried out. Some were modified to better suit the objectives of the project.

Instead of meeting with a refugee, they visited a refugee camp where they had the chance to see Syrian refugees and talk to them. Students also

- Analyzed and presented comments dealing with for and against comments related to current migrations in each participant country that had been posted on the social networks such as facebook and youtube
- All the students presented their work in national groups about migrations in recent years until today.
- An exhibition of all results about migrations in the present (photographs, documents, letters, testimonies, art work, etc); was set up for school publicity.
- · Students drew a mural about migrations
- They performed the project dance to the song as decided in the first LTTA

Furthermore students took part in a simulation game adapted from "Passages" an awareness activity the UNHCR to help people understand the plight of immigrants. After the game a discussion was held where students were asked to report their feelings and answer the question (listed in the timetable) what they would take with them if they had to flee their country

The Greek students staged a show to demonstrate their work. Parents and the local community were invited to attend. We are continuing the activities as planned. Besides, the tasks listed in the timetable we have been using web3 tools

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more so as to give our students more options in presenting their work. For Europe Day, the partners carried

For dissemination of the project in school were bought panels and also a lot of photos and collages were made.

Printing the magazine with interviews of migrating succesfull business people as a dissemination tool also.

How is the monitoring of the project being carried out so far and by whom?

The Romanian team sent out electronic evaluation questionnaires after each LTTA and TPM for feedback on the meetings. National coordination within the partner schools to monitor the progress and success of the tasks to be done was covered by holding colleagues' meetings and via WhatApp groups. A WhatsApp group was also started to facilitate multilateral communication and cooperation between partner schools. Furthermore online meetings were held in between LTTAs/TPMs. The update of the eTwinning platform and webpage have been regularly monitored by Romania (eTwinning) and Greece (WhatsApp).

How did the project partners contribute to the project so far? Has the distribution of tasks been adjusted since the application stage?

All partners carried out their tasks as assigned in the application. The organisation of LTTAs and TPMs was also carried out as planned and there have been no adjustments needed since the application stage.

If your project involves other organisations, not formally participating in the project, please briefly describe their involvement.

Some of the partners have already involved other organisations during the first project year, which mostly enabled us to get in touch with migrants or to get to know about migrants in history.

Portugal: immigrants' organisation in Terceira island through which they managed to find immigrants to participate in an event

Greece: visit of refugee camp in LM Village

Germany: visit of regional refugee camp in Braunschweig (Landesaufnahmebehörde Braunschweig) to be guided through an exhibition dealing with migration and flight from wars

Romania: cooperation with Europe Direct; visit and work at National Archives and National Institute of Statistics

If relevant, please describe any difficulties you have encountered until now in managing the implementation of the project and how you and your partners handle them.

The team has noticed that not only it is more and more difficult to ensure dissemination in bigger places like Braunschweig (Germany) but also in smaller places like the Azores (island of Terceira) in Portugal. Local media (newspaper and local/regional radio or TV channels) are less interested in reporting about international school projects such as Erasmus+. Some countries have observed that language abilities are restricting the number of teachers willing to participate in the project work and especially to go on trips abroad. Also we have encountered difficulties in fixing dates for the project meetings due to many fixed dates (holidays and exam times) in the different school schedules. Some schools have difficulties in the continuity of running the project because of the temporary placement of teachers, esp. in Portugal, Spain and Greece. Another problem that occurs is that the initial groups of students are shrinking or have to be replaced (students leaving or finishing school between project years) or that students' motivation is shrinking (esp. with those students who already went on mobilities). Finally we would like to point out that all partners find the eTwinning platform difficult to handle as a means of communication between students or between teachers as well as in terms of uploading material and results of the project work.

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5. Transnational Project Meetings

Please briefly describe each of the project's transnational project meetings, including its purpose, main agenda items, the outcome and the participants involved. In case there is a difference between what was planned and what was implemented, please explain why.

The first transnational meeting was held in Germany and it was the kick-off meeting for the project. Each partner presented their institution. We decided on the realization of the project activities to be accomplished and planned in detail the tasks we would implement during the first year according to our set timetable. We fixed the dates for the mobilities and distributed the tasks among us. We discussed the set-up of eTwinning space and the webpage. We also started work on the common questionnaire to assess students' knowledge on the topic of migrations from different perspectives. Additionally we laid out dissemination plans depending on each school's schedule and we discussed what would be required and what we planned to do for the first LTTA to be held in Portugal.

Finally, the students of the German school held a reading of a play in English: "A morning in front of Lampedusa" (by Antonio Umberto Ricco). For dissemination local media (newspaper) was invited but did not show up for the reading. In Romania, the meeting was disseminate on local media and in school.
