	<p><b>Currency</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If relevant, when was the information gathered?</li> <li>• When was it posted?</li> <li>• When was it last revised?</li> <li>• Are links functional and up-to-date?</li> <li>• Is there evidence of newly added information or links?</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Relevance/Coverage</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What is the depth and breadth of the information presented?</li> <li>• Is the information unique?</li> <li>• Is it available elsewhere, in print or electronic format?</li> <li>• Could you find the same or better information in another source (for example, a general encyclopedia)?</li> <li>• Who is the intended audience? Is this easily determined?</li> <li>• Does the site provide the information you need?</li> <li>• Your overall assessment is important. Would you be comfortable using this source for a research paper?</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Authority</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Who is the author/creator/sponsor?</li> <li>• Are author's credentials listed?</li> <li>• Is the author a teacher or student of the topic?</li> <li>• Does the author have a reputation?</li> <li>• Is there contact information, such as an e-mail address?</li> <li>• Has the author published works in traditional formats?</li> <li>• Is the author affiliated with an organization?</li> <li>• Does this organization appear to support or sponsor the page?</li> <li>• What does the domain name/URL reveal about the source of the information, if anything? Example: .com .edu .gov .org .net</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Accuracy</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Where does the information come from?</li> <li>• Are the original sources of information listed?</li> <li>• Can you verify any of the information in independent sources or from your own knowledge?</li> <li>• Has the information been reviewed or refereed?</li> <li>• Does the language or tone seem biased?</li> <li>• Are there spelling, grammar, or other typos?</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Purpose</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are possible biases clearly stated?</li> <li>• Is advertising content vs. informational content easily distinguishable?</li> <li>• Are editorials clearly labeled?</li> <li>• Is the purpose of the page stated?</li> <li>• Is the purpose to: inform? teach? entertain? enlighten? sell? persuade?</li> <li>• What does the domain name/URL reveal about the source of the information, if anything? Example: .com .edu .gov .org .net</li> </ul>
