




- Latvia's internet speed is among the fastest in the world, averaging 13.8MB/s
- Compared to 11.6 in the UK, 11.9 in the US, 7.5 in France, 3.4 in Brazil and 1.7 in Egypt
- In Riga there are 800 free connection points, that's why there's no need to pay







- The most popular sport in Latvia is ice hockey, and it punches well above its weight for a small country
- Dozens of Latvians play in the NHL and KHL, and the national team's fans are regarded as the loudest and most passionate around





How much of Latvia is covered by forests? a) $\frac{1}{3}$ (d

Forests

- Over half of the territory is covered by forests, so Latvia is a very green place

- Latvia is anything but mountainous. Its highest point is Gaiziņkalns, at 312 metres about sea level
- In order to surpass Suur
 Munamagi at 318 metres,
 they built a tower on top
- It was demolished in 2012 due to safety risks








Latvian flag

- Only Denmark's and Austria's flag has been around longer








- With almost 500 km of the coast, Latvia has lots of beaches
- There is space for everyone, whether you want to have fun in the sun or miles of sand to yourself, and best of all it's all open to the public






Rivers

- Latvia has 12,000 rivers and 3,000 small lakes - perfect if you like boat rides
- The total length of rivers flowing in Latvia is 38,400m, the length of the equator is 40,000m
- Latvia has the widest waterfall in Europe Ventas Rumba, its width is 249m







Ludza

- The first chronicles about this city of Latgale date back to 1177
- In the eastern part of Latvia, this beautiful region, rich in lakes and forests, was chosen for living by the Baltic Latgalian tribes as early as the first millennium BC



Potatoes


- The most popular food in Latvia is the potato
- On average, one person eats 78 kilograms per year






Blue jeans

- Jacob William Davis (Jēkabs Deivis) was a Latvian, American tailor who invented modern jeans
- Growing up in Latvia, he emigrated to the US as a young man
- He created jeans by using sturdy cloth and rivets to strengthen weak points in the seams, and partnered with Levi Strauss to mass - produce them
