From Capellades, Catalonia (Spain) to Zimnicea, Romania

Healthy habits Saturday, 2nd November, 2019

First, the mayor and a school teacher at the school presented us with a powerpoint, where they told us a little where each well-known city was located in the country and the fauna that exists there.

Afterwards, Romanian children taught us traditional dances in which we have been able to participate and, finally, the students and teachers of each country presented us and we exchanged gifts. They also gave us a shirt for everyone.

At 11:30 we finished and we went to have lunch at a restaurant located in Central Park. When we finished having lunch we went to the school, where three Romanian students presented us the School, and later they also presented us their project to reduce plastics in the oceans, seas...

Afterwards we visited the School individually, and then we went to the "computer lab" classroom to go on with the project.

When we finished, almost all the Catalan students went to a Romanian house with our partners.

At home we ate pancakes, played games ... and when we were tired, we went home.



Tuesday, 5th November, 2019

Tuesday, 5th November we went to Peles Castle and Bran Castle.

We met at six am to take the bus and we went to all the cities together to visit the castles.

Thursday, 7 November, 2019

On November 7, we met all Erasmus + students and teachers at 7 am and we spent 3 hours traveling to the capital with some stops in the middle. When we arrived in Bucharest, we went to the antipa or national museum where we were able to see a wide collection of different species around the world, but all or most of them were fake. Then we went back to the bus and we went to a restaurant to eat.

Then, we went to visit the Casa Poporului, the House of Parliament, a huge palace, the second largest in the world, built by President Nicolae Ceauşescu in 1984.

After the visit, our colleagues from the other countries were very tired, and they wanted to go to a shopping center. But we, together with the teachers who accompanied us, escaped to the center of Bucharest, the old town, by subway. We walked through very narrow but charming alleys. It was a very pleasant experience.
