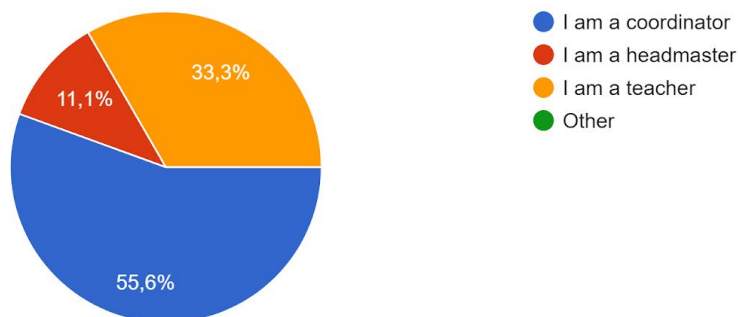
Participants in the meeting: 9 people (excluding the host country).

1. What is your current position ?

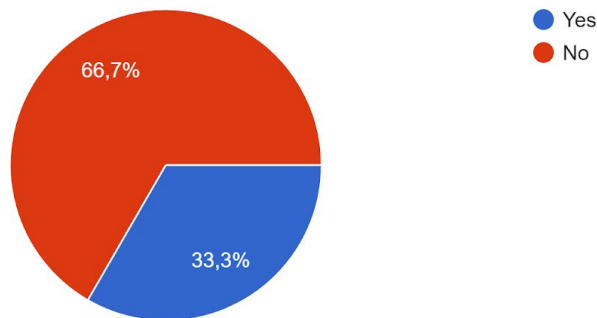
9 responses

2. Was this the first time you participated in an international mobility program?

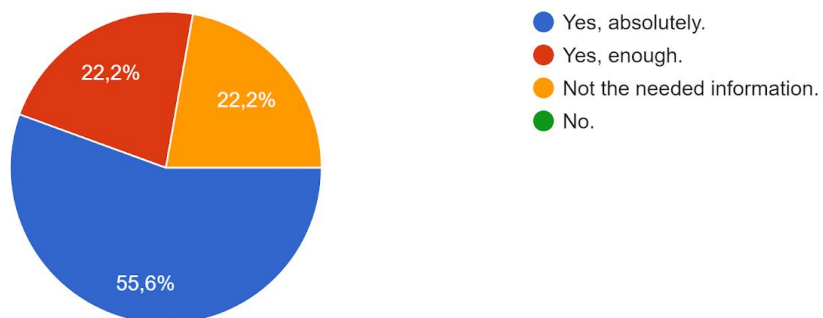
9 responses

3. Did you receive enough information from the host country about the best option to travel from the origin country till the final destination?

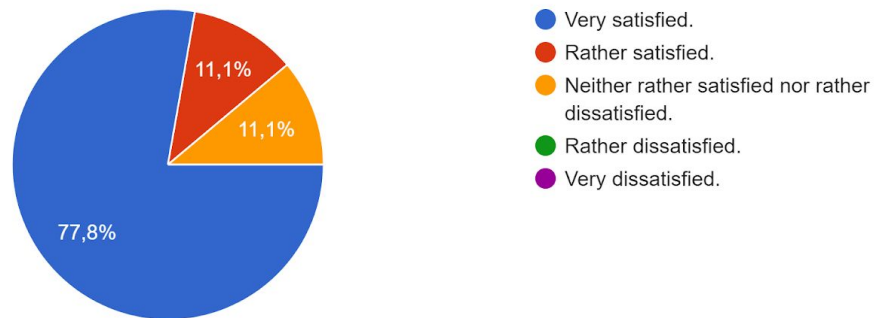
9 responses

4. How satisfied are you with your accommodation arrangements?

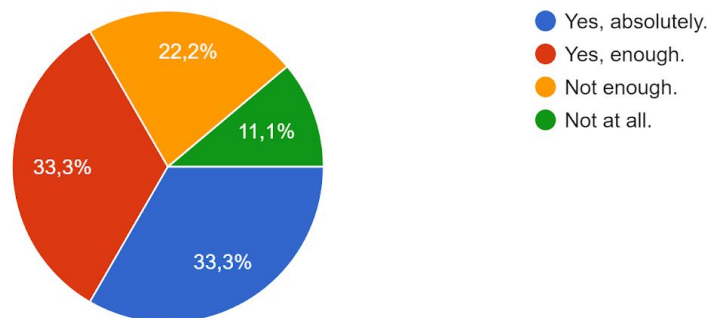

5. Did you get enough information to develop the required tasks previous to the meeting?

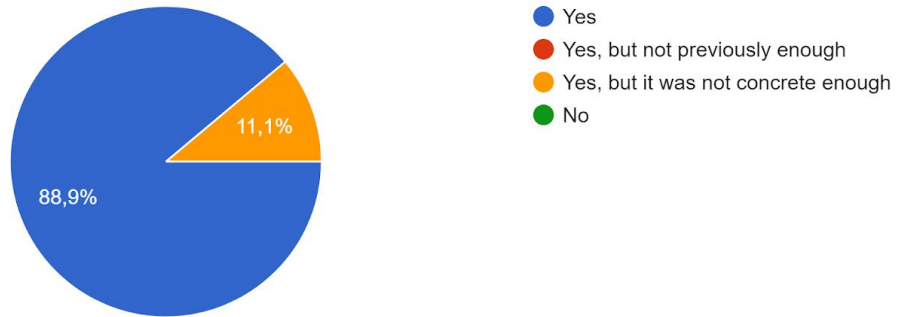

6. Did you receive previously the Meeting Plan?

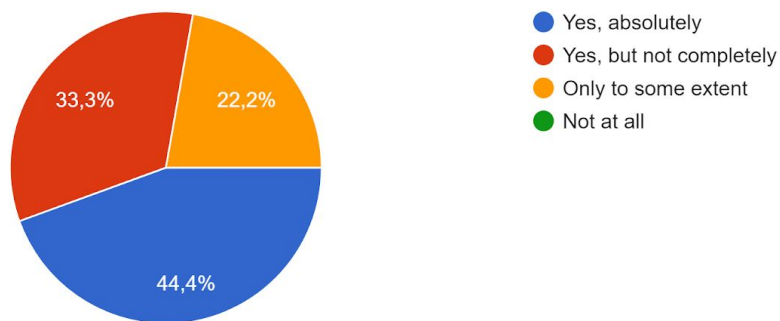

7. Do you believe the planned activities have been useful to achieve the goals of the meeting?

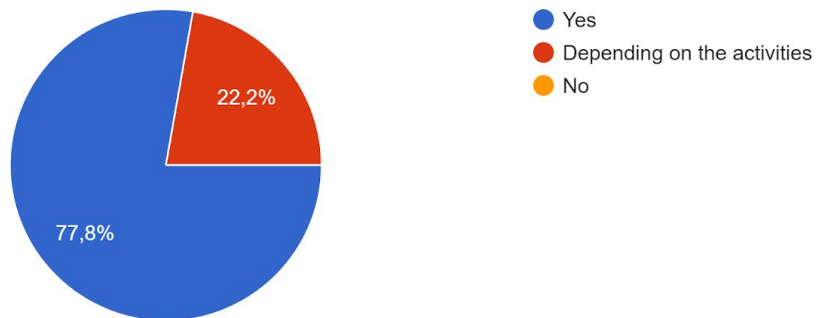
9 responses

8. Has English been the main used language to communicate during the meeting?

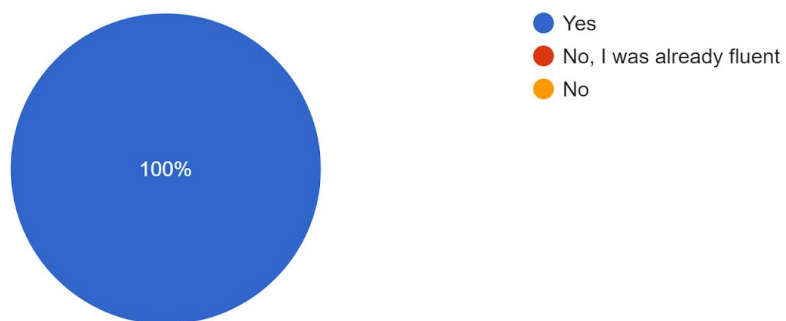

9. Do you feel you have improved your skills in this language during the meeting?

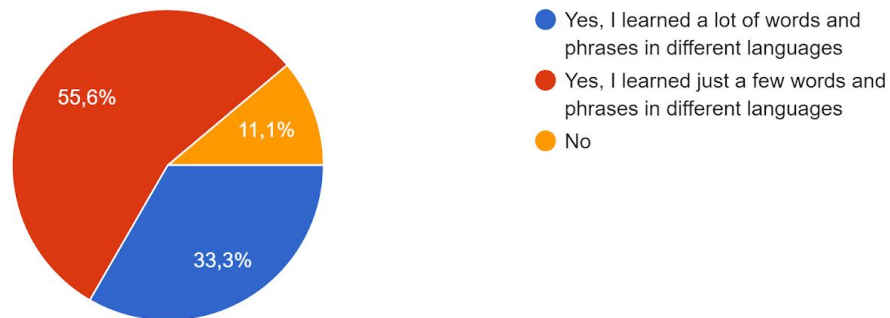

Everybody considers that they improved their skills in English.

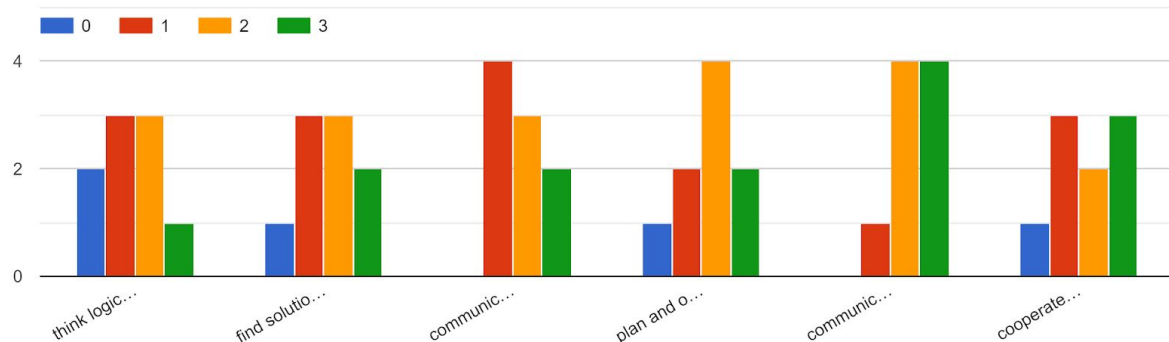
10. While participating in the meeting, did you improve your competence in other languages besides the main one used?

11. Through my participation in this mobility activity I learned better how to... (0-nothing....3-a lot)

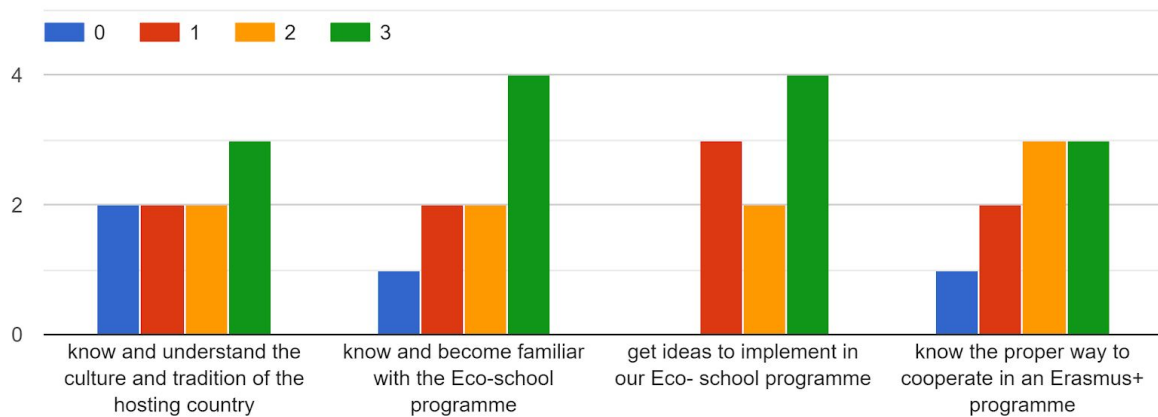


According to the graphic, we deduce that:

- 1.- Most participants improved their analytical skills between a little and a lot.
- 2.- Most consider that they improved their skills to solve problems between quite and a lot.
- 3.- Most consider that they improved how to communicate and express themselves in foreign languages between quite and a lot. 4 participants consider that only a little.
- 4.- Most participants consider that they learned how to plan and organise better tasks and activities
- 5.- Most think that they learned how to communicate better with people from different countries and cultures

6.- There is no agreement about if they improved or not their ability to cooperate in teams.

12. Participating in the meeting has allowed me to... (0-nothing....3-a lot)

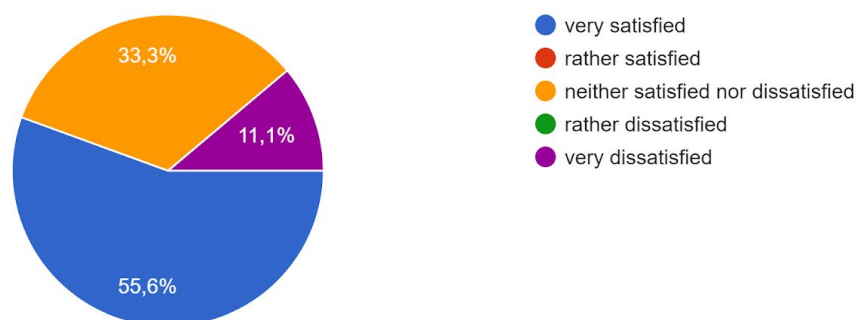


According to the graphics we deduce that participating in the meeting helped to:

13. How satisfied were you with the way the host partner dealt with any questions, complaints or problems that... your participation in the programme?

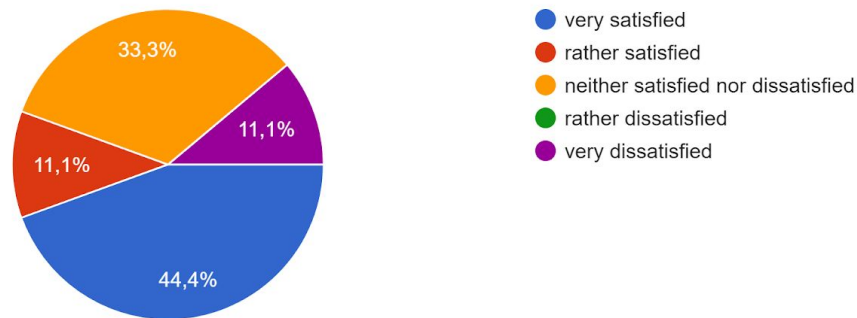

15. If you wish, please give any additional information, observations, comments or recommendations that may be useful for future project meetings.

Only three people gave suggestions:

Hosts do not care much about students, lack of activity in the afternoon, long and tedious program at school, teacher involvement only in school work time. In many situations have to wait long without information. Students often bored. Some teachers and students from countries were not treated the same. No try to integration of all teachers from all partners. Bad behaviour of Slovak teacher to foreign student. Very bad words in public of Slovak teacher to Slovak student. Morning activities, both at school and excursions, have been well prepared and planned. It has been a good experience to see how these issues are worked in another country.

I believe that it has failed to facilitate the integration of all students during the afternoons. Given that there were no host families and they (the students) had to be in the hotel, they (the host organisation) should have prepared activities to facilitate contact between them. They are too young, and some with little command of the English language, as if they were autonomously to relate to each other. During the few activities that were done the majority of the students, always, went with the members of their national team.

Students learnt about water in different ways, as needed to work on meeting topic. Students experienced school life in Slovakia enough. More time for all students integration and any sportiv activity after school should be planned by hosting partner in the future. Choose students of more relevant age, as possible at each school.
