



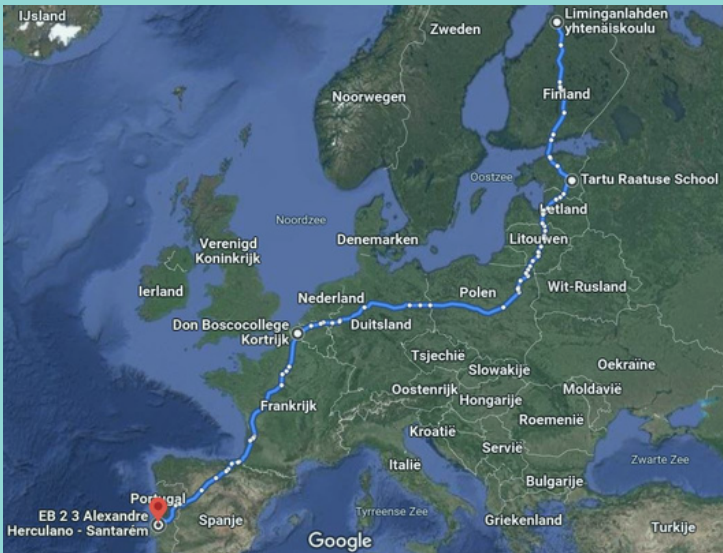

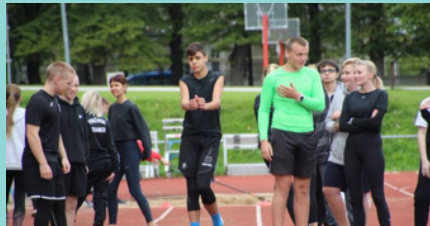
Disc golf is very popular here at the moment and a lot of boys and girls spend time in the forest throwing their discs and riding bikes. Have you heard about disc golf?

Would you be interested in starting a whatsapp group for the pupils to keep in touch and share photos?





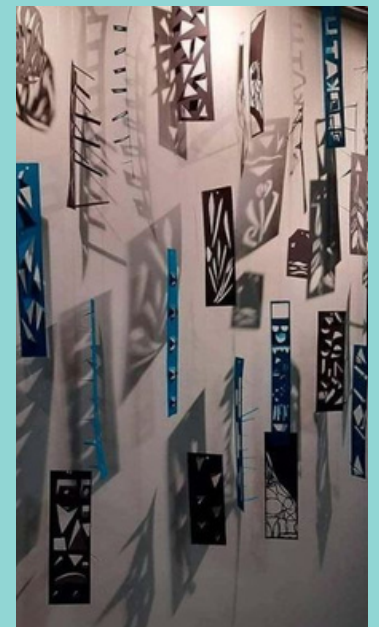
Hello from Tartu!
