<b>NEED OR PROBLEM AT THE BASE</b>	Unfortunately, not all people in our community can afford buying Christmas presents for their children.	
<b>DRIVEN QUESTION</b>	How can we develop, promote and preserve the beauty of <u>Christmas</u> in our community?	
<b>TITLE</b>	Community Christmas Giveaway.	
<b>TO WHOM IS IT ADDRESSED?</b>	Children in our community.	
<b>WHAT DO YOU WANT TO REALIZE?</b>	We want to make sure that all children in our community get a present for christmas.	
<b>WHY COULD THIS PROJECT BE USEFUL? WHAT COULD BE IMPROVED IN THE COMMUNITY?</b>	Firstly, giving to others makes us happy. It feels good to see others becoming happy. Although Christmas is not all about presents, we know that children like to get presents for Christmas. Secondly, when children return to school after christmas and ask "what did you get for Christmas", everyone can tell the others about at least one present".

Inform the students at our school and their parents about the project (write an information letter).</li> <li>3. Collect the presents.</li> <li>4. Make sure that the presents are in good condition.</li> <li>5. Wrap the presents.</li> <li>6. Hand the presents over to the Salvation Army.</li> </ol>	November/December
<b>WHO DOES WHAT roles and tasks</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Teacher contacts the Salvation Army</li> <li>- Teacher write an information letter to students/parents</li> <li>- Students collect the gifts</li> <li>- Students wrap the gifts</li> <li>- Students hand the gifts over to the Salvation Army</li> </ul>
