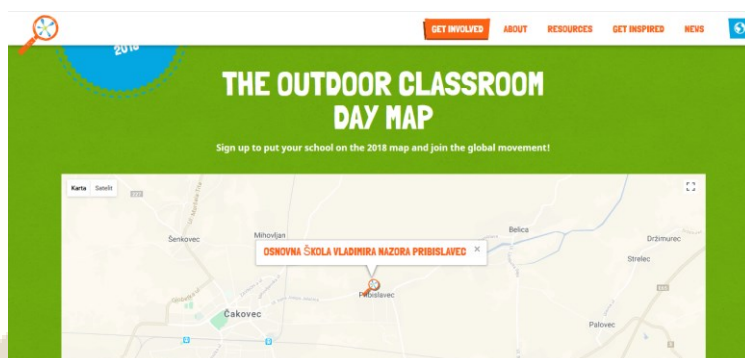


Outdoor Classroom Day in OŠ Vladimira Nazora Pribislavec, Croatia – short description May 2018



Mathematics (parallel lines and length measurement, units of length) and **ecology**.

At the basketball court, the students drew lines with a chalk, at a distance of one meter. The teachers prepared 12 jars with materials that are composted and not composted. Jars are labelled with numbers and a basket with little pieces of paper containing jar numbers was prepared. Each student received a green piece and a red piece of paper. The starting position for all the students was in the middle of the playground.

The teachers drew the little pieces of paper with the jar numbers, picked up the appropriate jar, and described what was in it. Students raised either the green or the red piece of paper depending on whether this material was to be put into compost or not. Students who answered correctly could advance one row in the direction of the compost. Pupils who did not answer correctly moved in the opposite direction.

After all the numbers for the 12 jars had been drawn, the pupils who were the closest to the finish line were given an additional question - to name some other materials that we put into compost, which we did not have in the jars. After answering the question, they reached the finish line - our compost.

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
