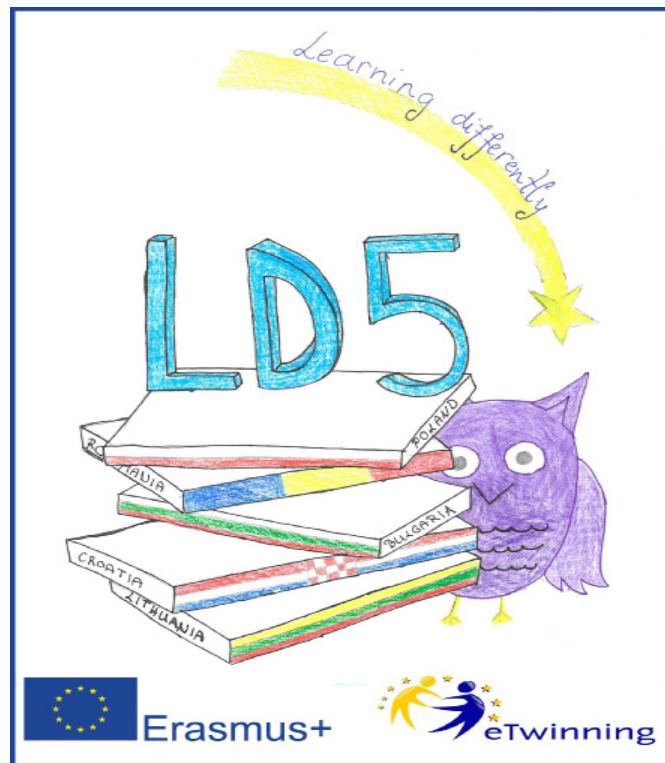

## ***How did this project affect you as a personality?***

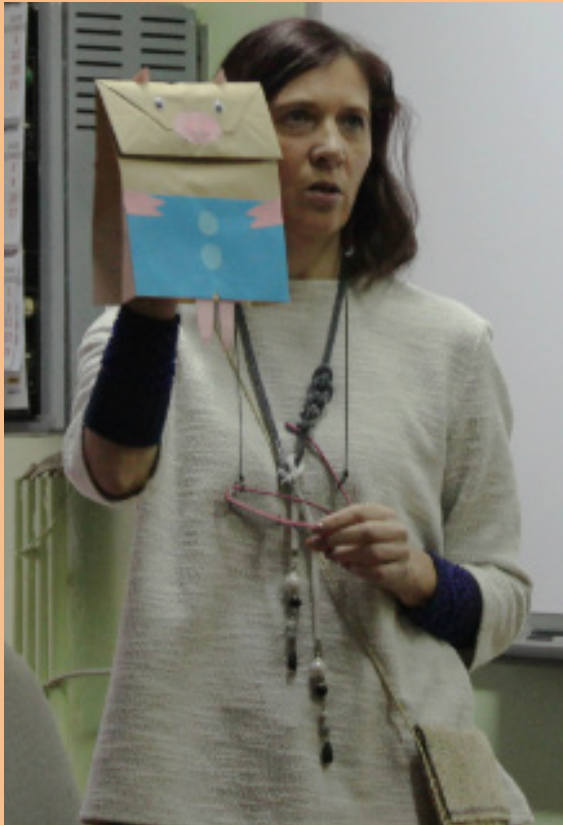
Project has done lots to my personality - I think I became more positive.

## *(Primary teacher)*

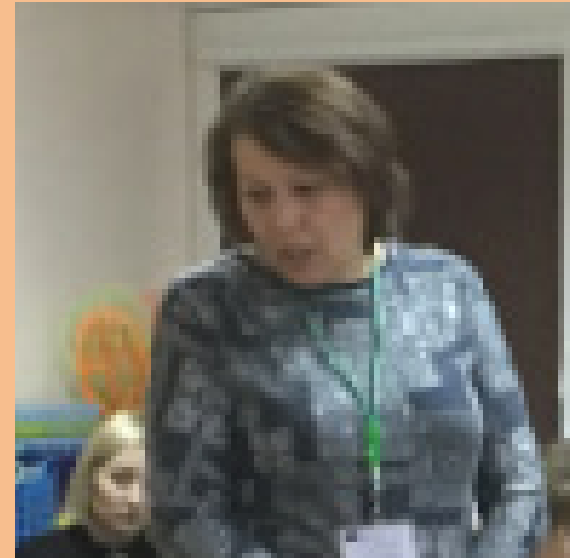
