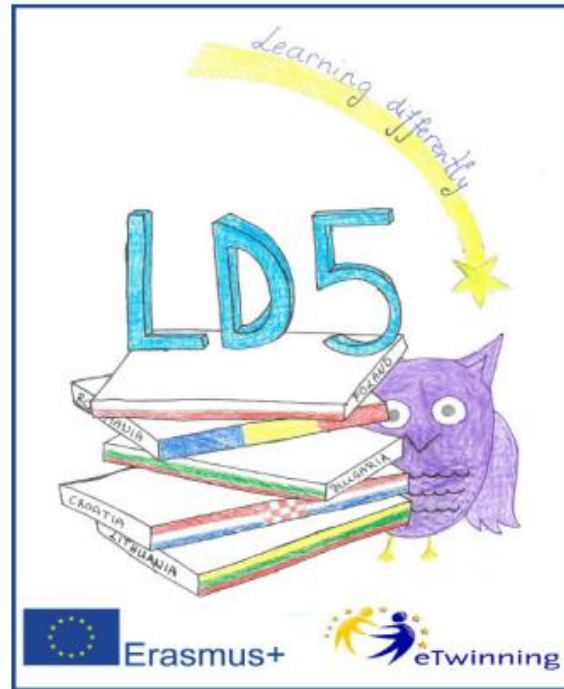

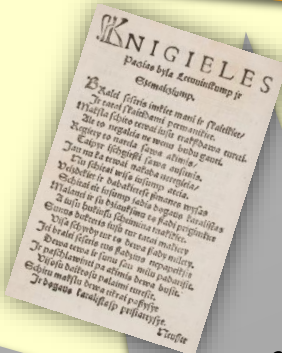

Croatia
