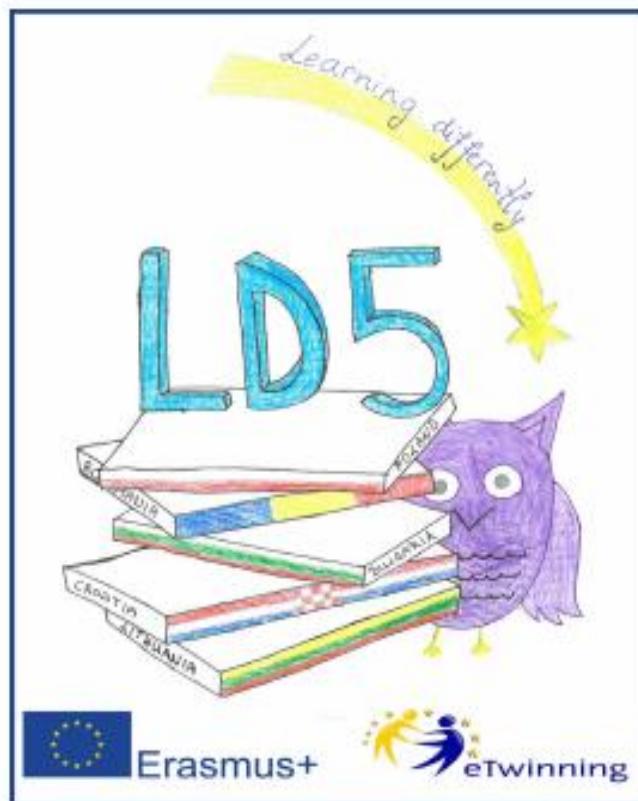

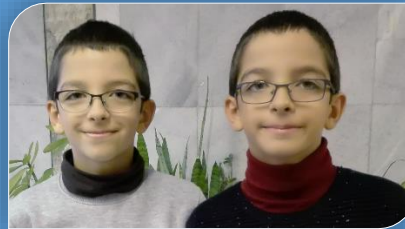

During the visit we all spoke in English, and this improved our communication skills.

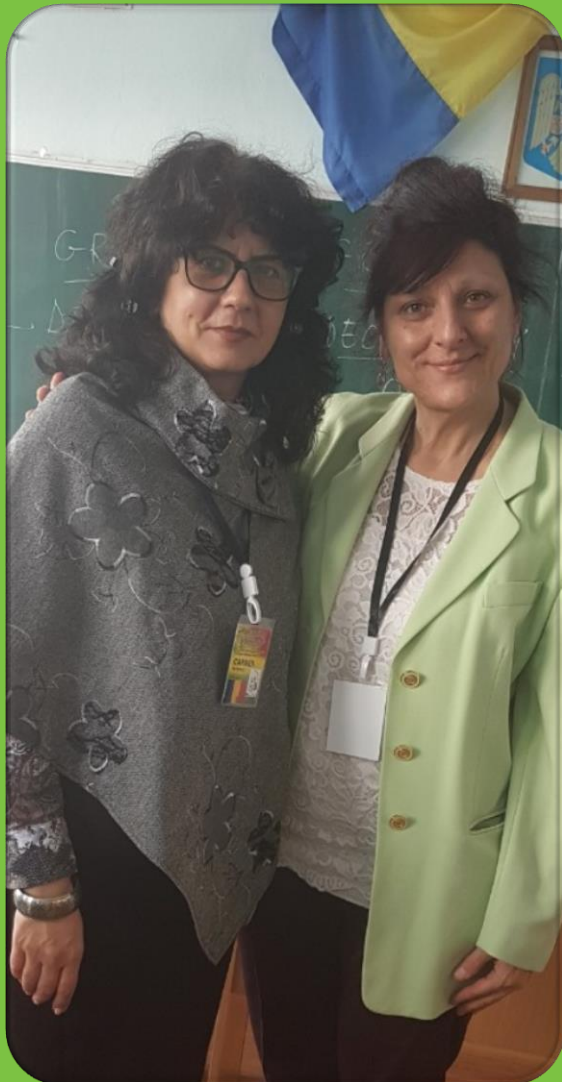
