The protagonist was the Ford Model A (1928), bigger and more beautiful.



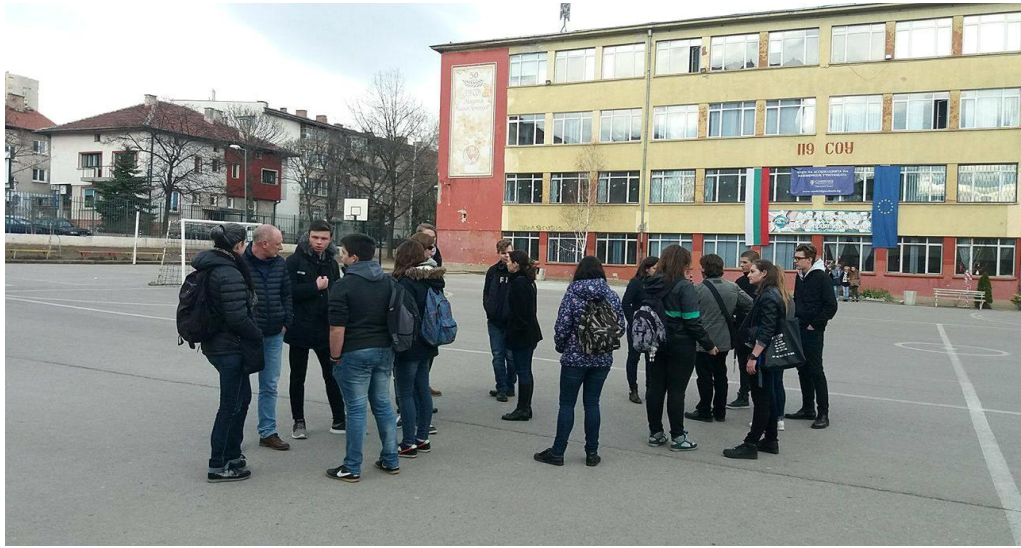

We had a little break to enjoy all the funny and interesting things in the building.

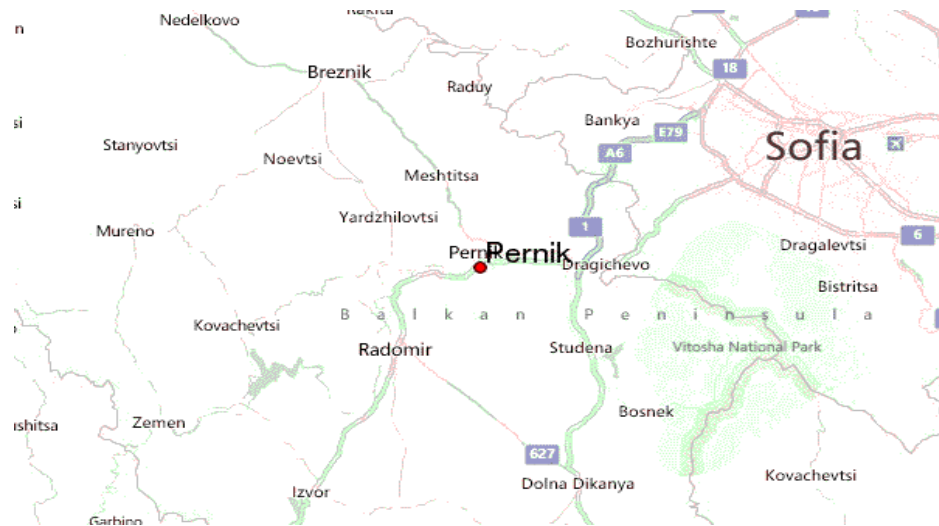


After all, we went to rooftop of the building to see how they recycle the water by collecting it with a specific technique and how to produce energy from the sun rays.

After the guided tour through the mine we took a few pictures and went to eat at a local restaurant. Before leaving the beautiful city of Pernik we went back to retrieve the ceramics that were made there and after that we had to wait for about 30 minutes for the train that took us back to Sofia. Also during the tour of the University we had the privilege of seeing the geological discoveries displayed at the University and some old petrified fish skeletons and even a Mammoth's skeleton.

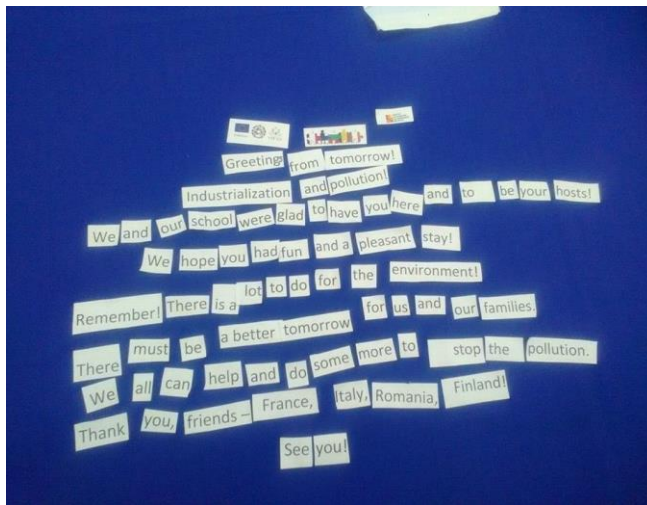


We asked a lot of questions about that process and became very surprised by the answers we got. After that we had another workshop: "Spectral research methods and their
