What is this?

Turkey's water transport

Turkey's main ports are listed as follows. The most important ports of our country are spoken in Istanbul, Izmir, Kocaeli, Trabzon, Samsun and Mersin. Mersin Port: Mersin port, which has 21 docks, provides loading and unloading services for nearly 30 vessels at the same time, depending on their size.
