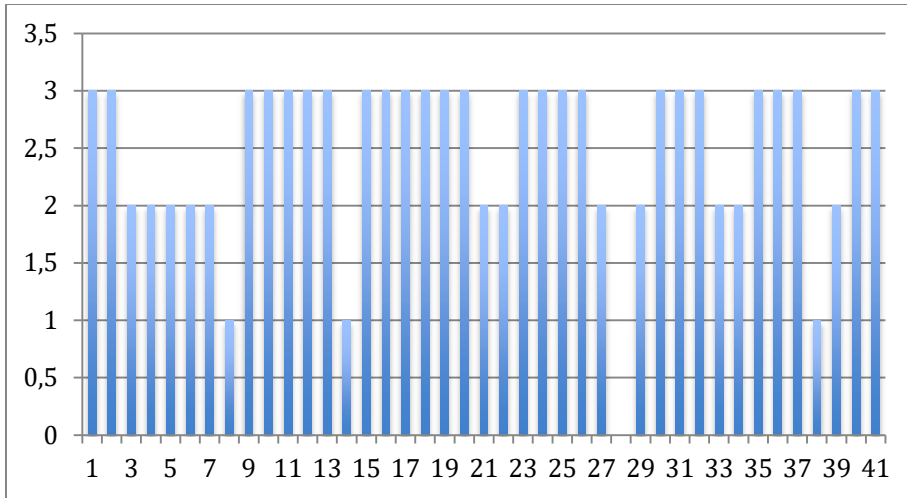
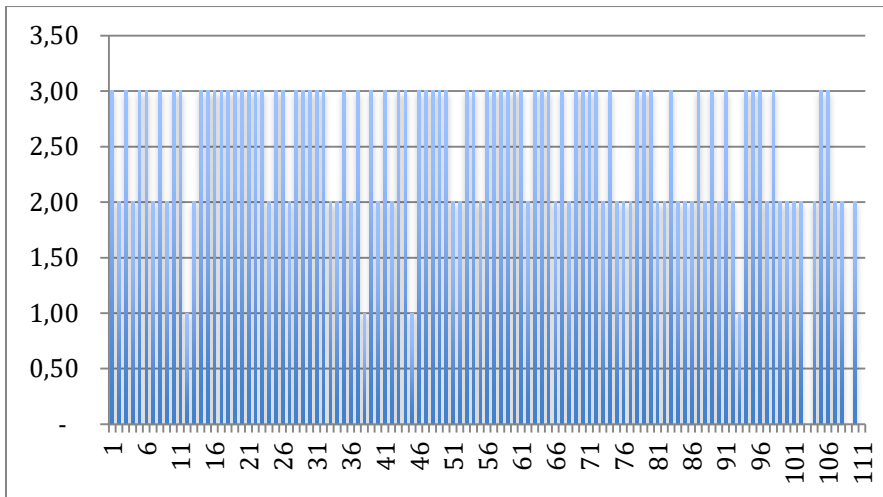


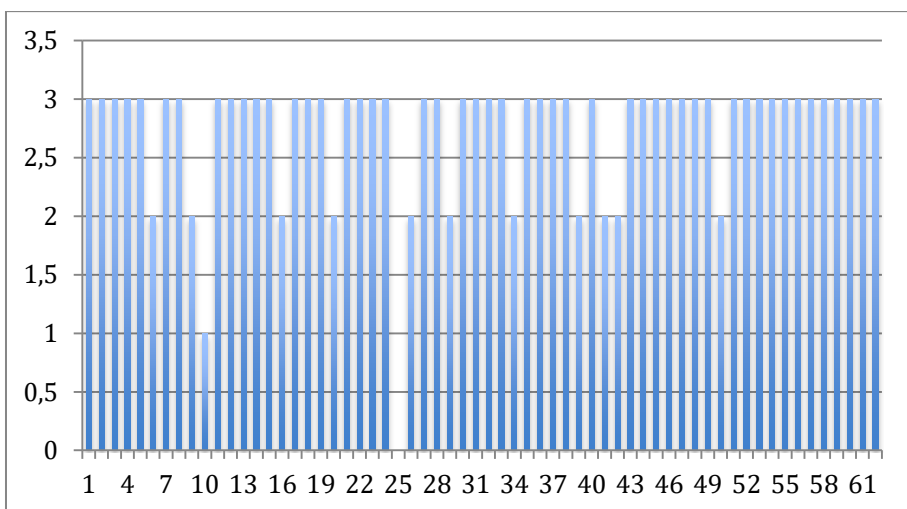
**Erasmus+ Stepping up to the Sustainable Development Goals -
questionnaire analysis.**



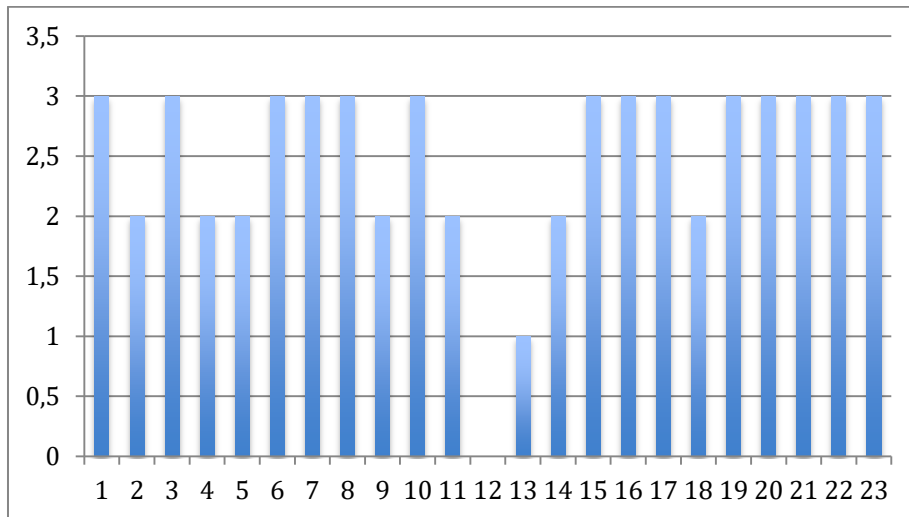
In Finland there are : 25 in regular use, 12 in use, 3 not in use. Average is 2,55



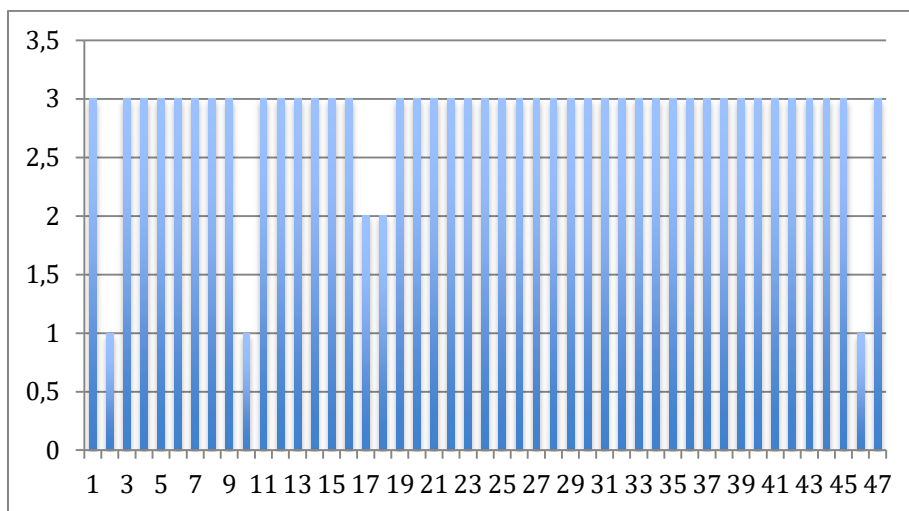
In Portugal there are : 65 in regular use, 40 in use, 4 not in use. Average is 2.56



In Réunion there are : 49 in regular use, 11 in use, just 1 (!!!) not in use. Average is 2.78



In Spain there are : 15 in regular use, 7 in use, 1 not in use. Average is 2,59



In Wales there are : 42 in regular use, 2 in use, 3 not in use. Average is 2,82

Summary with some percentages :

- 1° Wales : 85% in regular use, 8% in use, 7% not in use. The Average is 2,82/3
- 2° Réunion : 79% in regular use, 17% in use, 1% not in use. The Average is 2,78/3
- 3° Spain : 65% in regular use, 30% in use, 4% not in use. The Average is 2,59/3
- 4° Portugal : 59% in regular use, 36% in use, 4% not in use. The Average is 2,56/3
- 5° Finland : 63% in regular use, 31% in use, 3% not in use. The Average is 2,55/3

We have conducted a survey on the application of certain measures to achieve the objectives of sustainable development. This survey asks us about daily habits, small changes that allow us to live in a more eco-responsible way. The survey was conducted in several countries, including Finland, Portugal, Spain, Wales and Reunion.

We will focus on the results of the following question: "Do you recycle as much as possible? If your neighborhood or apartment complex does not offer recycling pickup, have you found a drop-off location or requested curbside pickup? For items such as batteries, cell phones and electronics, have you found an appropriate recycler?" This is an important change but rather simple to implement, just recycle and think like a good citizen and environmentally responsible.

The average results can range from 1 to 3, with 1 being a change not implemented at all, and 3 being a change in usage.

The results of the survey show us that Wales has the highest average score with 2.82, followed by Reunion with 2.78, then Spain with 2.59, which is followed by Portugal with 2.56, but almost equaled by Finland with 2.55. These results show that the countries are relatively equal in the measures taken to fight against global warming.

Also, the majority of those who responded to the survey are already taking action and this suggests some hope. Indeed, every country surveyed has an average of over 2.5.

Portugal and Finland have an average of 2.56 and 2.55 respectively. Such a low average compared to the others could be explained by a lack of possibility to recycle or a campaign for recycling. Indeed, many neighborhoods are not aware of recycling and many do not even know that a phone can be recycled by its operator.

As a solution, it could be proposed to carry out awareness campaigns, to intervene in high schools or in public places as well as to propose recycling possibilities that are easy to access and free for all.
