Studies show that lack of critical thinking results in conspiracy theorists. We believe that it is of importance that the students see the consequences of not relying on facts.


Source criticism

Conspiracy theories group assignment

During a couple of lesson they worked with a conspiracy theory

Flat earth, Global warming, 5G, 9/11, Corona pandemic, Quanon.

First they tried to convince us about "their truth"

Then they debunked the theory

Presentation

They presented this in their groups using a powerpoint

First they tried to convince us that their theory is correct, as you can see on their hats.

Then they debunked the theory and discussed the many different reasons why people fall for these conspiracies.



Essay

The students wrote an investigative essay where they first had to present how conspiracy theories arise and spread. Then they argumented for the dangers of C.T and how to refute them.

As a source they used an article named "Conspiracy theories - from 9/11 to Covid 19" (Science and progress, 2021:7)
