# Seminar on Administration and Management of Schools in Portugal

**Summary**: Administration as a set of procedures for managing people and resources that lead to the achievement of the goals established in the respect for the mission, vision and framework of values adopted by companies and other organizations. The administration of schools as a particular case of the administration of organizations. Characterization of school management in Portugal, the actors and their competences. The interrelation between the different structures that intervene in the educational process.

Aurélio Pires do Nascimento, graduated in Economics, has a specialization in School Administration. Teacher of the Board since 1975. Has held positions in the General Inspection of Education for 5 years. Was Director of Human Resources Services at the Algarve Regional Education Administration for 10 years. Has 17 years of school administration experience. Has regionally coordinated various implementation groups for school administration models and participated in others at national level.

## **Seminar on ECVET**

**Summary**: The European credit system for vocational education and training (ECVET) as an instrument helping individuals in transfer, recognition and accumulation of their assessed learning outcomes, to achieve a qualification or to take part in lifelong learning. The European Qualifications Framework (EQF) as a common European reference framework. National Europass Centres: Main functions. What is Europass for? How does it work? Documents issued by national authorities: the Europass mobility, the Certificate supplement and the Diploma supplement. European Skills Passport: How does it work? Europass Mobility. Vocational Education and Training systems in Europe. The European Credit System for Vocational Education and Training (ECVET) as a European instrument to support lifelong learning, the mobility of European learners and the flexibility of learning pathways to achieve qualifications.

Maria da Graça Ramalho Miranda de Carvalho is graduated in English and German as Foreign Languages. Teacher of the Board has already held all the positions of Intermediate Management, was President of the School Council and is now Coordinator of the Foreign Languages Department. Teacher responsible for several school trips in the country and abroad, for exchange programs and projects. Teachers' Trainer in collaboration to the University of Algarve for 12 years. Certified teacher in the area of Didatics by the Conselho Científico-Pedagógico da Formação Contínua, and registered in the Centro de Formação dos Estabelecimentos de Ensino de Albufeira.

Seminar on Didactic aspects of ICT in the reality of digital natives.

**Summary**: The second generation Digital Natives grow up, learn, communicate and socialize within a media ecosystem that is the Internet, they do not use digital media only as production and/or entertainment tools but they are in such a complete symbiosis with them that we can define them ' structural symbionts of technologies'. In other words, it means that the ICT teaching process and activity has undoubtedly to take into account this new and changing reality as well as the new learning environment: in order to have motivated students, eager to learn effectively and to get good learning results, it is no longer enough to teach how to create websites and blogs, how to deal with the graphical management of images, how to develop a code that may be used for videogames.

We need to know and understand the behaviour and, above all, the most common communicative practices among the DN2g, especially their propensity to share immediately their experiences (rather than fully living them), their reticular communication, their need to be 'always there' and on line visible and noticeable for their peers, their desire to share information and their irrepressible propensity to the multitasking activity. This brief seminar will illustrate some inspiring cues and ideas to help teachers put them into practice in their everyday ICT teaching activity.

# THE CLIL TEACHERS AND THEIR COMPETENCES HOW TO PLAN AND DELIVER CLIL MODULES IN PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL

Summary: The CLIL approach was supposed to become an institutional practice in Italian schools since 2010 but putting into action an effective CLIL module, namely succeeding in conveying and implementing CLIL theories in good practice still seems to be the main issue to face. The presenter will introduce the main features of the 'CLIL approach' and will also give a description of a real experience in a secondary school, with some practical examples, an attempt of introducing the CLIL approach and the presentation of its outcomes, thanks to the synergy between language and subject teachers.

Taking advantage of technology and activities such as the selection and use of multimedia, thought-provoking materials and contents, also available on the Net and ready to be used for the reference pre-activities, as well as personalising material consulting moments has proved to be the key strategy to propose accessible tasks to 'every' student.

Focusing attention on the students' research, selection and creation of contents to develop autonomously, together with student-friendly face-to-face specific CLIL activities, has resulted in good learning outcomes. Participants will see how teachers can devise activity timetables and lesson plans to make the most of the available resources, materials, collaborations.
