

Report pretest survey Midas Project

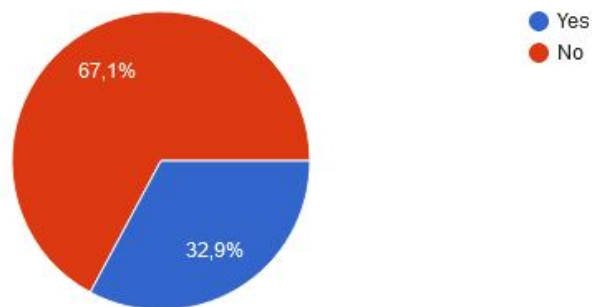
This pretest survey was answered by 70 students.

For about 2/3 of them, it is the first time they have heard of Etwinning. A big majority of the students (82,9%) think it will contribute positively to the evolution of their school.

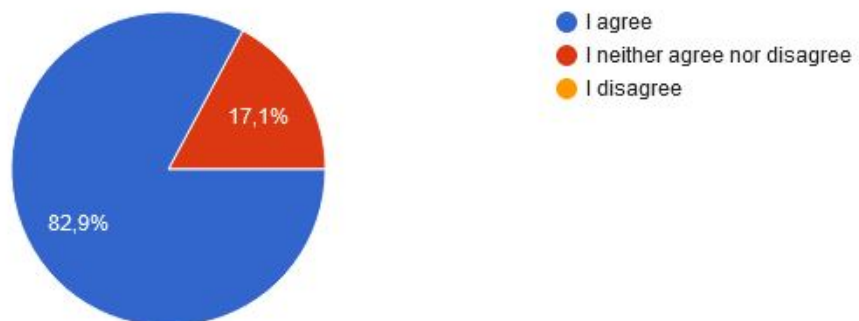
1- Have you ever been in an eTwinning Project before?

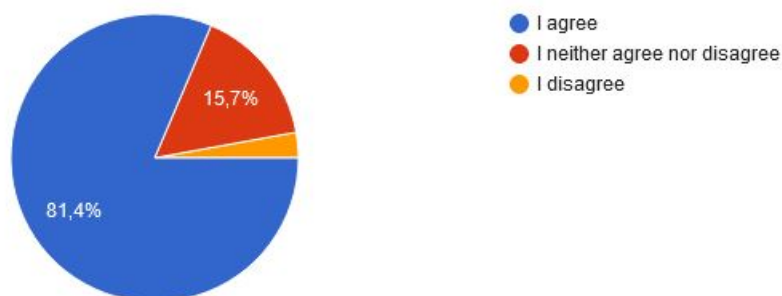


A help to learn better during the pandemic

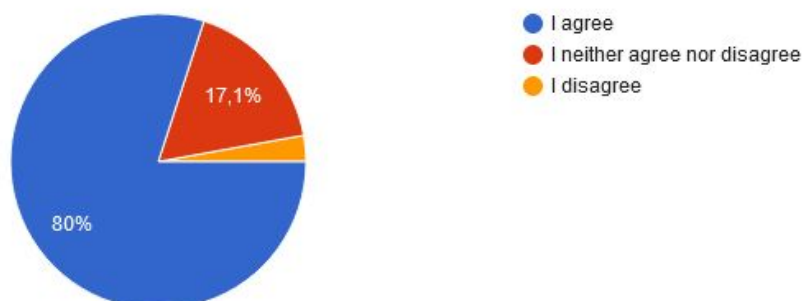
3- The international teamwork will help you learn better.

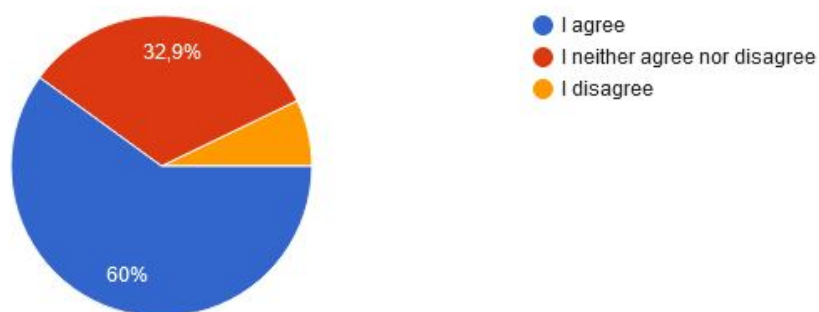
4- This eTwinning project will be part of your online lessons.

The students and Europe

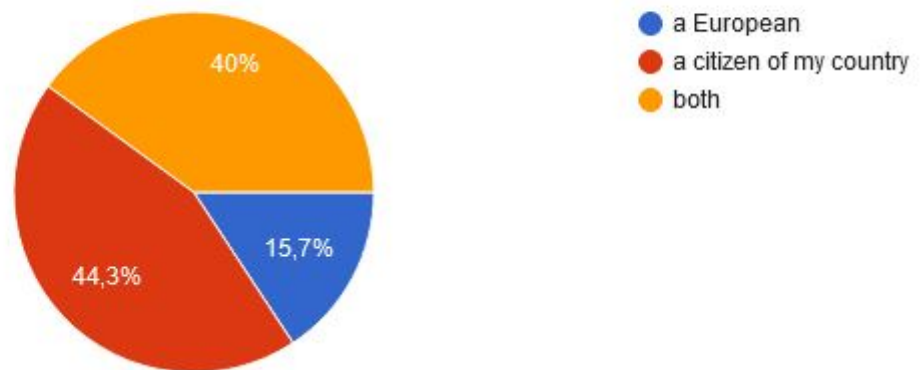
The results are more split concerning Europe. About as many students feel they are both a European (44,3%) and a citizen of their country. Only about 16 % feel they are mostly Europeans.

They are aware that being a European both involves advantages and responsibilities (80%).

Europe is a subject they sometimes or often talk about with their family (total 87%).

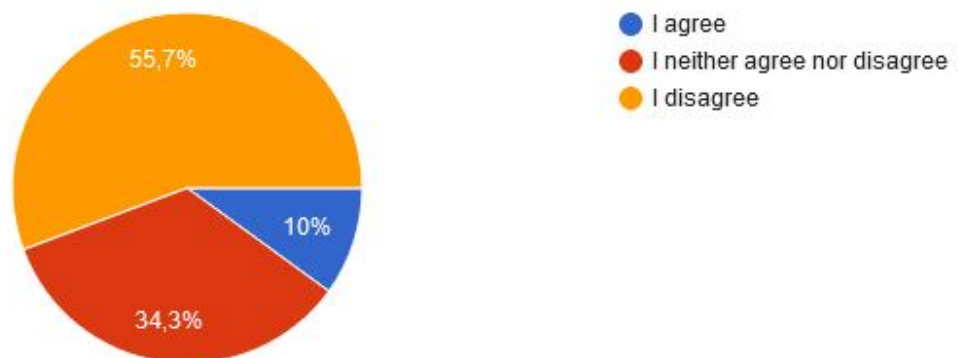
7- Would you define yourself first as a European, a citizen of your country or both ?

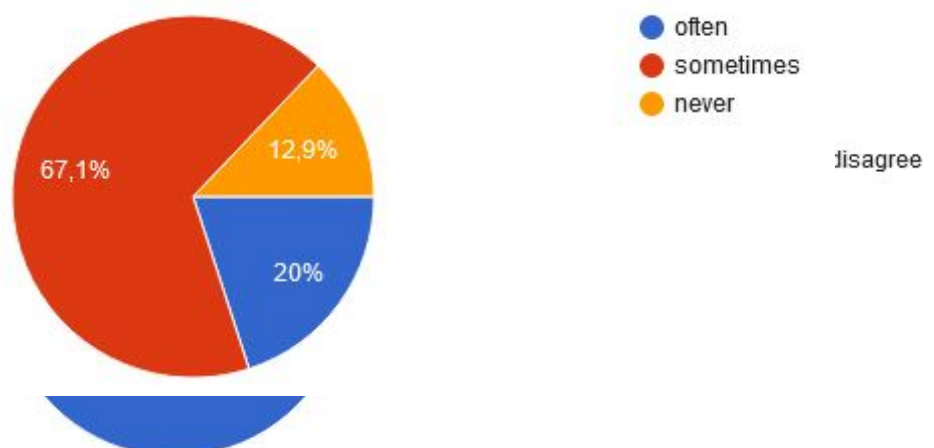
8- Europe is more an idea than a reality

Expectations about the project

Less students answered the final question about their expectations (51).

They mostly wish to make new friends (11 answers), want to know more about other cultures (9 answers) and work with students from other countries (5 answers). In a nutshell, they are interested in communicating with students from other countries.

They also logically expect to learn more elements about Europe, its institutions, its rules and creation and what it really means to be a European. (9 answers).

Lastly, they want to globally improve their knowledge and their skills, both at languages and Web 2.0 tools.
