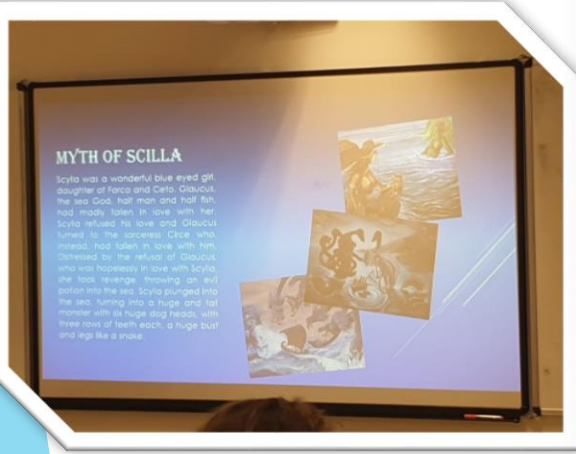

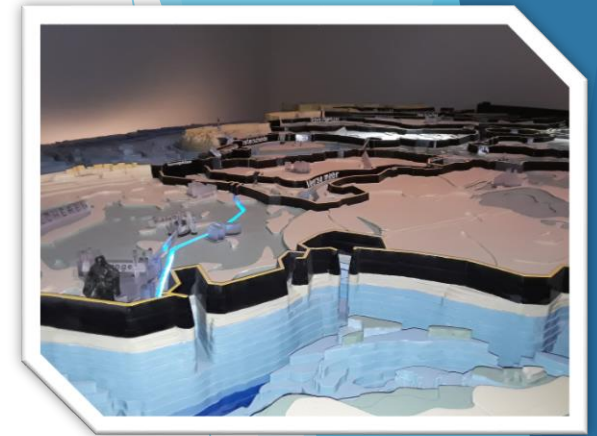

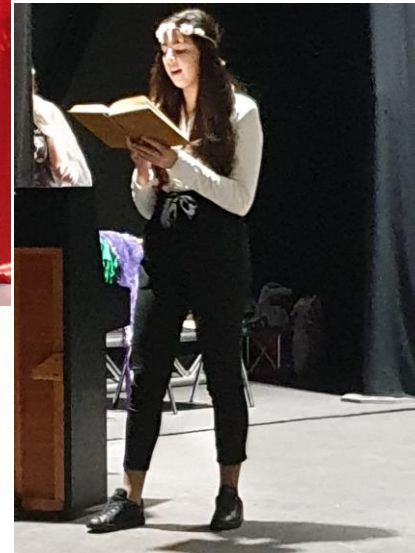


- ▶ Zeeland is an underwater land brought back to the surface characterized by landscape scenarios dominated by colossal dams and long bridges that connect the many islands that make it up. Its history was marked by a permanent struggle against the sea. The coast of Zeeland has changed continuously since the islands have been enlarged by flood deposition, united and protected by dams, or swept away by floods. The province was badly damaged by the flood of February 1, 1953, which killed over 1,800 people. Consequently, the Dutch government has started the implementation of the Delta Project, to stem the main maritime canals and further connect the islands to each other and to the mainland. After the dam repair following the 1953 flood, extensive rural reconstruction and resettlement of many Zeeland farmers was carried out. In the surroundings of Middelburg, inside the Delta park Neeltje Jans, there is the Delta Expo, a complex full of multimedia attractions entirely dedicated to the sea; visits to the immense barrier systems of the waters of the Scheldt estuary also start from the Delta Expo.
