*(**) Please note, your visit to BJA, coincides with a special Class Assembly. During the academic year, each class will lead an assembly on a theme of their choice, and they invite their parent sand any other family members to attend. Your visit coincides with Mercury Class Assembly, therefore you will be part of the audience along with the rest of the school and the parents/family members of Mercury Class. (**)*

Important information:

- 1) To help pay for transportation and a couple of lunches for the week, we ask that you **bring £60.00 cash each**, to give to Mrs Jan Whitehouse (Business Manager) at BJA on Wednesday 14th March. She will give you a receipt.
- 2) **When visiting UK schools and other educational establishments, everyone MUST ask permission from relevant staff, before taking any photos of children or young people, particularly if the photos you take are to go on Social Media (Facebook, Twitter etc).** This is very important. It may be that parental consent is needed.
- 3) For the activities on the Wednesday, please can everyone bring a photo of themselves younger than 10 years old. This can be digital (saved on phone/iPad/laptop) or printed out.
- 4) The NEC is huge!!!
 - a. It is split into different 'halls'. The Education Show will be in several halls. On their website, it says 'aim for Hall 7'....but it's best to check when you get there. Just keep following the signs for the Show!! Wear comfortable shoes, because you will do a lot of walking!
 - b. My advice would be to take a rucksack if you can....there's lots to look at and potentially buy...so you might want to carry it in a rucksack rather than plastic bags. Take my advice, however, stop periodically and go through everything you have accumulated – sometimes you end up with a lot of stuff you don't need! If you get to the show early, you might be lucky to find some free things on some stalls!
 - c. You will be wearing a badge. Some stallholders may ask to 'zap' you with their special barcode reader.
 - d. There are places to eat within the halls of the Education Show, the restaurants (and toilets) are usually located around the outside walls of the halls. Be warned, the food inside the halls of the Education Show can be more expensive (for what you get!) than the restaurants elsewhere in the NEC. You might want to leave the Education Show Halls and go to a restaurant just outside the halls, but still inside the NEC.
 - e. RS and J-MS are presenting in the 'Teaching with Creativity' Theatre from 10am to 10.30am.
