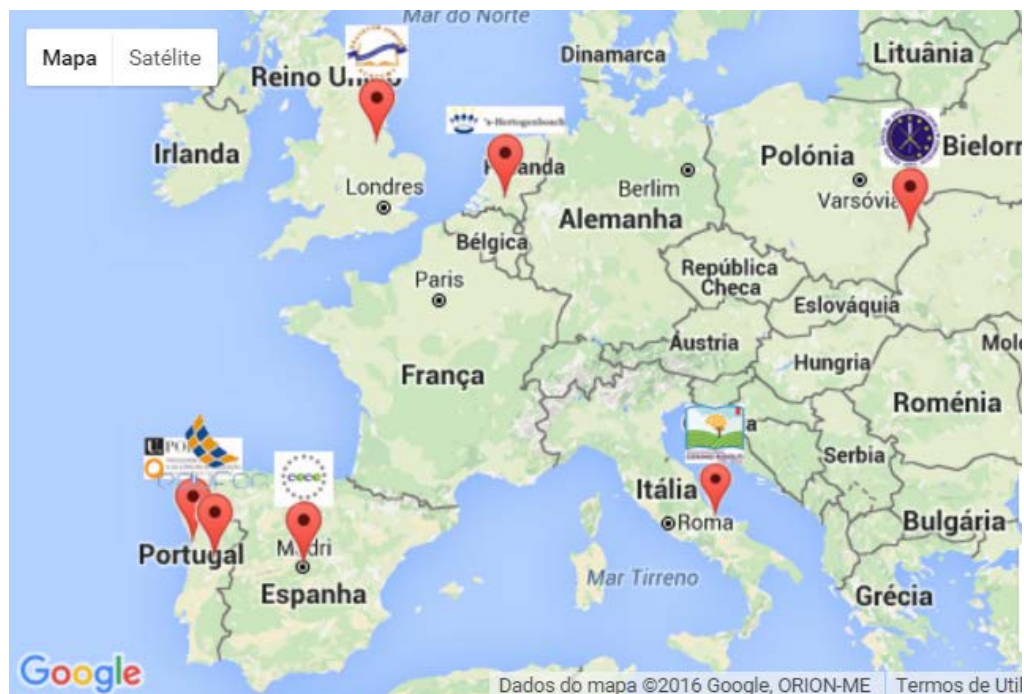

Schools' autonomy is a struggling issue within European educational systems. If national systems have different traditions concerning schools' power to define, decide and act by themselves, globalization and international agencies have been contributing to change and shape differently schools' autonomy concept and practices. The most relevant decisions concerning schools' autonomy are linked with educational offer; pedagogical main strategies; teachers and staff selection; financial and material resources management.

The training event that will be included within the project Managing @ School of Success is an opportunity to discuss and share some of these issues, both among project partners and with experts that were invited to participate.

- To share concerns and practices of partners regarding autonomy;
- To deep and foster questions concerning innovation within school management;

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Notes:

- (1) Oral Presentation: 1 minute each participant;
- (2) May attend Headmasters of local schools. In the debate, priority will be given to participants in M@SS Project.
- (3) The same idea of a "Erasmus+ Contact Seminar": allow contacts between the foreign participants and Portuguese Schools Headmasters (in addition to participating in M@SS).
- (4) Awaiting confirmation.
- (5) In order to disseminate the Event (as outlined in the project), they will be invited to attend the Debate with Stakeholders: Directors of Teacher Training Centre; Presidents of Municipal Council of Education; Intermunicipal Community Viseu Dão Lafões; Business Association; journalists, etc.
 - There are 3 visits to schools, but with different approaches.
 - For the first two lectures of the event, training will be considered Continuous Professional Development (CPD) for Portuguese Headmasters. For foreigners M@SS participants, all Short Term Joint Staff Training Event will be considered in Europass Mobility Document (CPD).
